PILOTTI - Massimo
(Italy)

Member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration; first Honorary President of the Supreme Court of Cassation of Italy since 1949; President of the International Institute for the Unification of Private Law (Rome)

Born 1879; doctor in jurisprudence 1900, began judicial career in 1901.

Member of the Italian delegation to the Peace Conference, 1919-1920; the London Conference for War Reparations, 1924; the Locarno Conference, 1925; the London Naval Conference, 1930; The Hague Conference for the Codification of International Law, 1929-1930; the Spa Conference and the Brussels Financial Conference, 1930.

Legal Adviser to the Reparations Commission and to the Conference of Ambassadors, 1929-1930; President of the Inter Allied Arbitral Commission (Rhine-land and Germany) for the assessment of contributions due to the armies of occupation 1925-1930; alternate delegate to the Assembly of the League of Nations, 1924-1932; member of the Italian delegation to the Disarmament Conference; President of the Chemical and Bacteriological Warfare Committee at the Disarmament Conference, 1932; Assistant Secretary-General of the League of Nations 1932-1937; Procurator General of the Supreme Court of Cassation of Italy, 1944-1948; member of the governing board of the Society for the Advancement of Science, 1946; member of the governing body of The Hague Academy of International Law, 1946; President of the "Tribunale Superiore delle Acque Pubbliche", 1948-1949.
