Letter dated 7 November 1994 from the Permanent Representative of Croatia to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

I would like to draw your attention to a new, recurring act of Serbian aggression against the Republic of Croatia. Yesterday evening, 6 November 1994, at approximately 1810 hours, Serbian paramilitary units from the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina launched a combined missile and artillery attack against the Croatian city of Zupanja and its surroundings. The Bosnian Serbs used multiple rocket launchers and 155 mm howitzers. A total of 30 missiles and 4 artillery shells of various calibers were fired, causing considerable material damage in the city. The attack ceased only after 2100 hours.

I should also like to reiterate the statements from the previous letters (S/1994/960, S/1994/969, S/1994/982, S/1994/987, A/49/383-S/1994/1052, A/49/393-S/1994/1062 and S/1994/1213) addressing the same issue, in which my Government emphasized that it considers the continuation of the present situation as a threat to the security and territorial integrity of the Republic of Croatia. The ongoing peace process and stability in the wider region are seriously jeopardized by such acts of aggression by the Bosnian Serbs, and this series of events must not be allowed to continue unabated.

I would kindly request distribution of the present letter as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda item 148, and of the Security Council.
