The Sixth Committee has considered Item 18 (a) of the agenda for the second part of the First Session of the General Assembly relating to the official seel and emblem of the United Nations. The Committee recommends that the General Assembly should adopt the design reproduced in the Annex. This design may be described as follows:

"A map of the world representing an azimuthal equidistant projection centered on the North Pole, inscribed in a wreath consisting of crossed conventionalized branches of the olive tree; in gold on a field of amoke-blue with all water areas in white.

"The projection of the map extends to 600 south latitude, and includes five concentric circles."

- The Sixth Committee proposes that the General Assembly should recommend to the Members of the United Nations that they take measures for the legal protection of the emblem and the name "United Nations" against their use by non-outhorized persons, particularly for commercial purposes by means of trade marks or commercial labels.
- The Sixth Committee therefore recommends the adoption by the General Assembly of the following resolutions:

## Official Scal and Emblem of the United Nations

## THE CENERAL ASSEMBLY

PECOGNIZES that it is desirable to approve a distinctive emblem of the United Nations and to authorize its use for the official scal of the Organization;

## RESOLVES THEREFORE

that the design reproduced below shall be the emblom and distinctive

- .... sign of the United Nations and shall be used for the offical seal of the Organization.
  - 2. CONSIDERS that it is necessary to protect the name of the Organization and its distinctive emblem and offical seal;
    RECOMMENDS THEREFORE
    - (a) that Members of the United Nations should take such legislative or other appropriate measures as are necessary to prevent the use; without authorization by the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and in particular for commercial purposes by means of trade marks or commercial lebels, of the emblem, the official seal and the name of the United Nations, and of abbreviations of that name through the use of its initial letters:
      - (b) that the prchibition should take effect as soon as practicable but 'n any event not later then the expiration of two years from the adoption of this resolution by the General Assembly;
        (c) that each Member of the United Nations, pending the putting into effect within its territory of any such prohibition, should use its best enceavours to prevent any use without suthorization by the Secretary-General of the United Nations of the emblem, name, or initials of the United Nations, and in particular for

commercial purposes by means of trade marks or commercial labels.
