For the existing text *substitute*

17. Greece, in the framework of its development cooperation policy, granted bilateral development assistance of about 80, 90 and 80 million euros to the affected countries in 2000, 2001 and 2002 respectively. The major recipients were Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Serbia and Montenegro. In the above-mentioned official development assistance, amounts relating to technical cooperation, as well as urgent humanitarian assistance, food and financial assistance, are included. Private investments are not included therein.
