Report of the Second Committee*

1. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 19 September 2003, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its fifty-eighth session the item entitled:

"Environment and sustainable development:

- "(a) Promotion of new and renewable sources of energy, including the implementation of the World Solar Programme 1996-2005;
- "(b) Implementation of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification in Those Countries Experiencing Serious Drought and/or Desertification, Particularly in Africa;
- "(c) Convention on Biological Diversity;
- "(d) Further implementation of the Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States;
- "(e) International Strategy for Disaster Reduction;
- "(f) Protection of global climate for present and future generations of mankind;
- "(g) Sustainable mountain development"

and to allocate it to the Second Committee.

2. The Second Committee considered the item at its 12th to 18th meetings, on 16 and 17 and from 20 to 22 October 2003.
