Utilization of the provision for special political missions under section 3, Political affairs

Twenty-ninth report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions

1. The Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions has considered the report of the Secretary-General on the utilization of the provision for special political missions under section 3, Political affairs, of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2004-2005 (A/C.5/58/33).

2. The Advisory Committee notes that the provision of 163,178,100 (before recosting) sought for special political missions under section 3 of the proposed programme budget for 2004-2005 (see A/58/6 (Sect. 3) and A/58/6 (Corr.1)) is equivalent to 169,431,700, after recosting. As indicated in the report of the Secretary-General, after charging the recosted amount of 142,476,900 against the provision for special political missions, good offices and other political initiatives authorized by the General Assembly and/or the Security Council (see A/C.5/58/20 and A/58/7/Add.18), the remaining unallocated balance for special political missions amounts to 26,954,800.

3. The Advisory Committee recalls that any further requirements for special political missions beyond this balance arising during the biennium 2004-2005 would be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 11 of annex I to General Assembly resolution 41/213 of 19 December 1986.

4. The Advisory Committee recommends that the General Assembly take note of the report of the Secretary-General (A/C.5/58/33).
