

Relevant estimated requirements are also included in support of the establishment of an open-ended intergovernmental expert group to be convened between the twentieth and twenty-first sessions of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice to exchange information on best practices, as well as national legislation and existing international law, and on the revision of existing United Nations standard minimum rules for the treatment of prisoners so that they reflect recent advances in correctional science and best practices, in line with paragraph 49 of the Salvador Declaration, as endorsed by the Twelfth United Nations Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice.
