Organization of work

Note by the Secretariat

1. In order to assist the Sixth Committee in the organization of its work, the Secretariat finds it appropriate, in the light of General Assembly resolutions 1898 (XVIII) of 11 November 1963 and 32/71 of 9 December 1977 and of rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, to draw the attention of the Sixth Committee to the following.

Items allocated to the Sixth Committee

2. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 17 September 2004, the General Assembly allocated 17 items to the Sixth Committee. The list of those items is contained in the letter dated 17 September 2004 from the President of the General Assembly to the Chairman of the Sixth Committee (A/C.6/59/1).

Documentation relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee

3. The following table lists the documents of the fifty-ninth session of the General Assembly relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee. It includes references to the reports of commissions or committees and the reports that are to be submitted by the Secretary-General pursuant to resolutions or decisions of the Assembly at preceding sessions, as well as to the documents circulated under the agenda items allocated to the Sixth Committee,¹ in accordance with requests of Member States.

Date for concluding the work of the Committee, order and approximate dates of consideration of items

4. Rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly provides that:

“Each Main Committee, taking into account the closing date for the session fixed by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the General Committee, shall adopt its own priorities and meet as may be necessary to complete the consideration of the items referred to it. It shall at the beginning of the session adopt a programme of work indicating, if possible, a target date for the conclusion of its work, the approximate dates of consideration of items and the number of meetings to be allocated to each item.”
5. Bearing in mind the number of meetings available to the Sixth Committee (see para. 11 below), it is proposed that the Committee set a target date of 11 November 2004 for the conclusion of its work.
6. The Sixth Committee may wish to consider, for the purpose of adopting its programme of work, the following timetable, which indicates approximate dates of consideration for the agenda items referred to it, and has been drawn up on the basis of the relevant General Assembly resolutions and previous programmes of work adopted by the Committee:

Establishment of working groups and holding of consultations

7. Concerning agenda item 148, entitled “Measures to eliminate international terrorism”, the General Assembly, in its resolution 58/81 of 9 December 2003, decided that the work (of the Ad Hoc Committee established by General Assembly resolution 51/210 of 17 December 1996) should continue, if necessary, during the fifty-ninth session of the General Assembly, within the framework of a working group of the Sixth Committee. In the light of the recommendation of the Ad Hoc Committee contained in paragraph 14 of its report² and following further consultations with the Bureau of the Ad Hoc Committee, 5, 6 and 8 October have been reserved for that purpose.

8. Concerning agenda item 149, entitled “Scope of legal protection under the Convention on the Safety of United Nations and Associated Personnel”, the General Assembly, in its resolution 58/82 of 9 December 2003, requested the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its fifty-ninth session on the measures taken to implement the resolution. It also decided to include the item in the provisional agenda of its fifty-ninth session, and that “the work shall continue during the fifty-ninth session of the General Assembly within the framework of a working group of the Sixth Committee”. In the light of the above and following consultations with the Bureau, 11, 12 and 14 October have been reserved for that purpose.

9. In view of the limited conference services available to the Sixth Committee (see para. 11 below), any meetings for working groups or for informal consultations would have to be accommodated in place of, rather than in addition to, meetings allocated to the Committee.

Deadline for submission of draft resolutions with financial implications

10. According to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, “no resolution involving expenditure shall be recommended by a committee for approval by the General Assembly unless it is accompanied by an estimate of expenditures prepared by the Secretary-General”. It is therefore imperative that the Sixth Committee allow sufficient time for the preparation of the estimates of expenditure by the Secretariat and for its consideration by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and by the Fifth Committee. Under the circumstances, if 11 November is accepted as the concluding date for the work of

the Sixth Committee (see para. 5 above), 29 October 2004 would have to be considered as the mandatory deadline for submission to the Fifth Committee of draft resolutions with financial implications.

Conference resources available

11. The available conference facilities will, in principle, enable the Committee to hold no more than 9 or 10 plenary meetings per week and the working groups referred to in paragraphs 7 and 8 above to hold, respectively, 6, and 4 meetings for the week. Morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

12. In order to avoid difficulties in the organization of services for the meetings of regional groups of the Committee, it is suggested that all requests for such meetings be channelled to the Planning and Meetings Servicing Section through the Secretary of the Committee.
