Sixty-first session Sixth Committee

Organization of work

Note by the Secretariat

1. In order to assist the Sixth Committee in the organization of its work, the Secretariat finds it appropriate, in the light of General Assembly resolutions 1898 (XVIII) of 11 November 1963 and 32/71 of 9 December 1977 and of rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, to draw the attention of the Sixth Committee to the following.

Items allocated to the Sixth Committee

2. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 13 September 2006, the General Assembly allocated 14 items to the Sixth Committee. The list of those items, organized under headings corresponding to the priorities of the Organization in the medium-term plan for the period 2002-2005 (or in the strategic framework, as appropriate), with an additional heading for "Organizational, administrative and other matters", is contained in the letter dated 18 September 2006 from the President of the General Assembly to the Chairman of the Sixth Committee (A/C.6/61/1).

Documentation relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee

3. The following table lists the documents of the sixty-first session of the General Assembly relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee. It includes references to the reports of commissions or committees and the reports that are to be submitted by the Secretary-General pursuant to resolutions or decisions of the Assembly at preceding sessions, as well as to the documents circulated under the agenda items allocated to the Sixth Committee,¹ in accordance with requests of Member States.

Date for concluding the work of the Committee, order and approximate dates of consideration of items

4. Rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly provides that:

"Each Main Committee, taking into account the closing date for the session fixed by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the General Committee, shall adopt its own priorities and meet as may be necessary to complete the consideration of the items referred to it. It shall at the beginning of the session adopt a programme of work indicating, if possible, a target date for the conclusion of its work, the approximate dates of consideration of items and the number of meetings to be allocated to each item."

5. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 58/316 on further measures for the revitalization of the work of the General Assembly, the Sixth Committee, at its 23rd meeting during the sixtieth session, adopted a provisional programme of work for the sixty-first session, which was noted by the Assembly in its decision 60/513 of 8 December 2005. The following programme has been prepared on this basis taking into account the allocation of items by the General Assembly at its 2nd plenary meeting.

6. At the same meeting, the General Assembly, upon the recommendation of the General Committee, fixed the target date of 9 November for the completion of the work of the Sixth Committee (A/61/250, para. 14), which has also been taken into consideration in the preparation of the following work programme.

Holding of consultations

7. In view of the limited conference services available to the Sixth Committee, as indicated in paragraph 9 below, any meetings for consultations would have to be accommodated in place of, rather than in addition to, meetings allocated to the Committee.

Deadline for submission of draft resolutions with financial implications

8. According to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, "no resolution involving expenditure shall be recommended by a committee for approval by the General Assembly unless it is accompanied by an estimate of expenditures prepared by the Secretary-General". It is therefore imperative that the Sixth Committee allow sufficient time for the preparation of the estimates of expenditure by the Secretariat and for its consideration by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and by the Fifth Committee. As 9 November has been fixed as the concluding date for the work of the Sixth Committee (see para. 6 above), 29 October 2006 would have to be considered as the mandatory deadline for submission to the Fifth Committee of draft resolutions with financial implications, except for draft resolutions concerning the items that will be considered after that date.

Conference resources available

9. The available conference facilities will, in principle, enable the Committee to hold no more than 6 to 8 plenary meetings per week. Morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

10. In order to avoid difficulties in the organization of services for the meetings of regional groups of the Committee, it is suggested that all requests for such meetings be channelled to the Planning and Meetings Servicing Section through the Secretary of the Committee.
