PROPOSED PARTICIPATION OF THE DEMOCRATIC PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF
 KOREA IN THE ACTIVITIES OF THE UNITED NATIONS INDUSTRIAL
 DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION (UNIDO) AS A MEMBER

Report of the Secretary-General

Reproduced below is a communication from the Executive Director of UNIDO, informing the Secretary-General that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea has decided to become a member of UNIDO (the communication from the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Democratic Republic of Korea is attached to the present document as annex I):

"I am hereby transmitting to you copy of a letter dated 5 January 1980 from His Excellency Mr. Ho Dam, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, together with an English translation. By this letter I was informed that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea has decided to be a member of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO).

"Since the present status of UNIDO does not allow for membership of UNIDO as such, the request of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea may be interpreted as the expression of its wish to participate in the activities of UNIDO and to be eligible for election to the UNIDO Board as envisaged in paragraph 3 of General Assembly resolution 2152 (XXI) establishing UNIDO.

"Therefore, you may consider to inform the General Assembly at its thirty-fifth session of this wish of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, so that this country be included in the list A of the annex to resolution 2152 (XXI) concerning the States eligible for membership in the Industrial Development Board."

The Committee may wish to consider this question, at its present meeting, and inform the General Assembly at its thirty-fifth session, so that this country may be included in the list of participating non-Member States under the appropriate heading.

Resolution 34/97 adopted by the General Assembly on 13 December 1979, listing the States which are eligible for membership in the Industrial Development Board is contained in annex II.

Annex I

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS OF THE
DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF KOREA ADDRESSED TO THE EXECUTIVE
DIRECTOR OF UNIDO

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea has decided to be a member of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization.

I avail myself of this opportunity to have the pleasure to request you to accept the delegation of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea attending the Third General Conference of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization held in India as one of a full member State of the organization.

The Democratic People's Republic of Korea is already a member State of IAEA and a member of such United Nations specialized agencies as WHO, UNESCO, UPU, ITU, WMO and FAO and has set up its Permanent Observer Mission to the United Nations in New York and the Permanent Observer to the United Nations Office at Geneva, and permanent representation to the other international organizations in Geneva.

The Government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea officially accepts the duties of the member States of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization provided for in the charter of the organization and, accordingly, solemnly declares that it will faithfully discharge its mission from the very moment of being a member of this organization.
