

## Technical assistance and cooperation on human rights in Kyrgyzstan

The Human Rights Council,

Recalling the Charter of the United Nations and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,

Recalling also General Assembly resolution 60/251 of 15 March 2006,

Recalling further Council resolution 5/1 of 18 June 2007,

Bearing in mind the change of government that took place in Kyrgyzstan on 7 April 2010,

*Deeply concerned* at the loss of life that occurred on 7 April 2010 during the protests leading to the change of government,

- 1. *Strongly condemns* the human rights violations committed during the protests surrounding the change of government;
- 2. Calls for a full and transparent investigation that holds perpetrators accountable for the loss of life of 7 April 2010;
- 3. *Encourages* Kyrgyzstan to promote and protect all human rights and fundamental freedoms and to promote respect for democracy and the rule of law;
- 4. *Notes with appreciation* the participation of Kyrgyzstan in the universal periodic review process in May 2010, and welcomes its commitment to implement recommendations accepted at the Review;
- 5. Expresses its support and encouragement for regional and subregional efforts made to restore democratic and constitutional order and the rule of law in Kyrgyzstan;
- 6. Calls upon Kyrgyzstan to uphold its commitment to the human rights principles enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and to all its international human rights obligations;
- 7. Encourages Kyrgyzstan to engage in a genuine process of open dialogue and national reconciliation to enhance peace for the people of Kyrgyzstan;

8. Requests the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to continue to provide technical assistance through her office in Bishkek and to work with the Government of Kyrgyzstan and other actors, as needed, to identify areas of technical assistance that will assist Kyrgyzstan in its ability to fulfil its human rights obligations, and to submit a report thereon to the Council for consideration at its seventeenth session.
