





## Statement by Josefina Vidal Ferreiro, General Director for the United States Division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs

Once again the Cuban Government's repeated complaints that the United States Government continues to carry out subversion plans against Cuba have been confirmed.

Further to an April 2014 report on the covert "Zunzuneo" project, the United States news agency Associated Press published an article on 4 August that documents another of these plans financed by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) to negatively influence Cuban youth. This project, which the United States Government shamelessly admits having designed and implemented, attempted to politicize young Cubans previously identified by Latin American emissaries recruited for this purpose, and to organize them in opposition to the Cuban Government.

These facts confirm that the United States Government has not given up its hostile and interventionist Cuba strategy, to which it devotes millions of dollars every year in an attempt to create instability in order to bring about changes in our political system.

The United States Government must once and for all desist from all subversive, illegal and covert actions against Cuba, which violate our sovereignty and the express will of the Cuban people to perfect our economic and social model and strengthen our democracy.
