Extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions

Human rights law guarantees that all people have the right to a good life and prohibits arbitrary deprivation. The continuing practice of extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions in many parts of the globe poses ongoing challenges to the full realization of this norm. Many of these problems stem from the inadequate regulation or oversight of states who use force. Deaths in custody are a major source of concern, particularly in heightened state duties concerning the incarcerated. Fairness in, and the progressive abolition of, the death penalty constitutes another important priority in the field, as does enforce strict limits on the use of lethal force by law enforcement. Extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions are not new to the winds of India. In India extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions are acts of violence carried out by law enforcement agencies without any judicial authorization. On 4 June 2021 night, Mangboilal Louvum, age 29 years of Chalwa village of Kangpokpi district, Manipur died after he was allegedly shot at by Major Alok Sathe, post commander and some personnel of the 44 Assam Rifles (E Company) in civvies. People of his village took him to Kangpokpi Hospital Succumbed to his wounds before reaching the Hospital. Mangboilal Louvum was the father of four little children and a daily wage earner. People of Manipur on Monday demanded a prompt, thorough, effective and impartial investigation into the June 4 incident in which a village man died in a shootout incident involving Assam Rifles personnel. Extrajudicial Execution Victim Families Association (EEVFAM) and Human Rights Alert (HRA) alleged that the incident was a clear case of extra-judicial killing. I urge this Council to ask the Indian government to ensure prompt, thorough effective and impartial investigation and a fair trial is carried out in a civilian court by respecting the verdict of the Supreme Court as well as the international human rights standards.
