

Whenever people are forced to leave their country due to war and occupation, they have the right to be supported. All people who face any form of threat including war, violence, and harassment deserve to be protected. Everyone has the right to be safe.

The people of the Islamic Republic of Iran always consider themselves to be with the Afghans and will support them with all their hearts. Therefore, despite these conditions, we request you to provide safe conditions for their lives by trying to create peace and stability in Afghanistan and by removing sanctions, help them to have more access to educational, health, welfare and livelihood facilities.
