Requests the Industrial Development Board and the Executive Director of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization to report to the General Assembly at its twenty-ninth session, through the Economic and Social Council, on the further progress of the preparatory work for the Second General Conference of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization.
