#### **Note by the Secretary-General**

- 1. The thirtieth session of the Committee against Torture will be held at the United Nations Office at Geneva (Palais Wilson) from 28 April to 16 May 2003. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 28 April 2003 at 10 a.m.
- 2. In accordance with rule 6 of the rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has prepared, in consultation with the Chairman of the Committee, the attached provisional agenda for the session. Annotations to the provisional agenda are also attached.
- 3. Pursuant to rule 31 of the rules of procedure, the meetings of the Committee will be held in public unless the Committee decides otherwise or it appears from the relevant provisions of the Convention that the meetings should be held in private.
- 4. The attention of the States parties is drawn, in particular, to the annotations to item 4, which contain the tentative timetable for the consideration of reports. In accordance with rule 66 of the rules of procedure, representatives of States parties are invited to attend the meetings of the Committee when their reports are examined.
- 5. At its twenty-ninth session the Committee decided that a working group should meet prior to its thirtieth session. The working group is scheduled to meet at the United Nations Office at Geneva, Palais Wilson, from 23 to 25 April 2003.
