# Consideration of reports submitted by States parties under article 18 of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women

Article 18 of the Convention provides that States parties to the Convention shall undertake to submit to the Secretary-General, for consideration by the Committee, a report on the legislative, judicial, administrative or other measures that they have adopted to give effect to the provisions of the Convention and other progress made in this respect. Reports are to be submitted within one year after the entry into force of the Convention for the State concerned and thereafter at least every four years and further, whenever the Committee requests.

At its thirty-seventh session, the Committee, taking into account the criteria of preference to be given to those States parties whose reports had been pending for the longest time, the need to give priority to initial reports and the desirability of balance of reports in terms of geographic and other factors, decided to invite eight States parties to present their reports. Eight States parties agreed to that request.

At its thirty-eighth session, the Committee will have before it the following reports: the initial report of Mauritania (CEDAW/C/MRT/1); the combined initial and second periodic report of Mozambique (CEDAW/C/MOZ/1-2); the combined initial and second periodic report of the Niger (CEDAW/C/NER/1-2); the combined initial, second and third periodic report of Pakistan (CEDAW/C/PAK/1-3); the initial report of Serbia (CEDAW/C/SCG/1); the combined initial, second, third, fourth and fifth periodic report of Sierra Leone (CEDAW/C/SLE/5); the initial report of the Syrian Arab Republic (CEDAW/C/SYR/1) and the combined initial, second and third periodic report of Vanuatu (CEDAW/C/VUT/1-3).

Rule 51 of the rules of procedure provides that representatives of a State party shall be present at meetings of the Committee when the reports of the State are being examined and shall participate in discussions and answer questions concerning the reports. The Secretary-General has informed the States parties concerned of the tentative dates on which their reports are scheduled for consideration by the Committee at its thirty-eighth session.

Rule 49 of the rules of procedure provides that, at each session, the Secretary-General shall notify the Committee of the non-receipt of any report required from a State party under article 18 of the Convention. The Secretary-General also provides the Committee with a list of reports submitted by States parties to the Convention. The Secretary-General also provides the Committee with a list of reports submitted by States parties to the Convention that have not yet been considered by the Committee.

At its thirty-eighth session, the Committee will have before it the report of the Secretary-General on the status of submission of reports by States parties under article 18 of the Convention (CEDAW/C/2007/II/2).

A pre-session working group of the Committee is convened before each session to prepare a list of issues and questions relating to reports for transmission to the representatives of States parties before the meetings at which their reports are to be considered. The pre-session working group for the thirty-eighth session met in New York from 31 July to 4 August 2006. The report of the pre-session working group and the responses of States parties to the lists of issues and questions drawn up by the pre-session working group will be before the Committee.

#### Item 5

# Implementation of article 21 of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women

Article 21 of the Convention provides that the Committee may make suggestions and general recommendations based on the examination of the reports and information received from States parties. It also provides that such suggestions and general recommendations shall be included in the report of the Committee, together with comments, if any, from States parties.

Task forces on a general recommendation on article 2 of the Convention and on migrant women, respectively, will brief the Committee on progress achieved.

Under this agenda item, the Committee also provides opportunities for specialists from the specialized agencies and other United Nations entities to present to the Committee, in plenary meeting, information related to specific articles of the Convention or to issues being considered for general recommendations and suggestions.

Article 22 of the Convention provides that the specialized agencies shall be entitled to be represented during the consideration of the implementation of such provisions of the Convention as fall within the scope of their activities and that the Committee may invite the specialized agencies to submit reports on the implementation of the Convention in those areas. At its thirty-eighth session, the Committee will have before it a note by the Secretary-General on reports of specialized agencies on that subject (CEDAW/C/2007/II/3 and addenda).
