REPORT OF THE THIRD SESSION OF THE COMMISSION  
ON HUMAN RIGHTS  
(Paragraphs 20 and 21)

Financial Statement Presented by the Secretary-General in  
Accordance with Rule 30 of the Rules of Procedure  
of the Council

- I. Paragraph 20 of the report of the third session of the Commission on Human Rights carries no financial implications.
- II. With regard to paragraph 21 concerning the Yearbook on Human Rights, the Secretary-General has the honour to recall that in his report "Supplementary Estimates for the Financial Year, 1949, document A/C.5/279" he drew the attention of the Fifth Committee of the third session of the General Assembly to the fact that the selection of court decisions relating to human rights to be included in the Human Rights Yearbook would require the services of one additional official. The additional expenses involved, for which no provision was included in the original 1949 budget estimates, were given as follows:

Salary for one post, grade 14 (as from 1 July 1949)	\$3,025
Cost of living and expatriation allowances	<u>325</u> \$3,350

In its 16th Report of 1948 (document A/765) the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions reported on this item as follows:

"Item (i): Human Rights Yearbook

"5. The Advisory Committee recommends that the amount of \$3,350 for the services of one additional official to assist in the preparation of the Yearbook should be provided out of the appropriation already recommended under Section 11."

This recommendation was adopted by the Fifth Committee.
