

Fifth periodic report of Nicaragua (continued) (E/C.12/NIC/5; E/C.12/NIC/Q/5)

- 1. At the invitation of the Chair, the delegation of Nicaragua joined the meeting via video link.
- 2. **The Chair** invited the delegation to reply to the questions raised by Committee members at the previous meeting.
- 3. **Mr. Murillo** (Nicaragua) said that the questions had been forwarded to the capital and responses were awaited.
- 4. **Mr. Mancisidor de la Fuente** (Country Rapporteur) said that the Committee would examine the responses carefully and, provided that they were received in a timely manner, would consider them in the drafting of its concluding observations on the State party's fifth periodic report. However, written responses were not a substitute for dialogue between the Committee and the State party. In accordance with its rules of procedure, the Committee would examine the State party's report in the absence of a dialogue.
