Summary

The present note has been prepared following a decision of the Forum at its fifth session to develop a questionnaire designed to enhance the reporting of intergovernmental organizations to the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues. The note contains a draft questionnaire for consideration by the Forum.

Introduction

- 1. The present note is submitted in accordance with the decision taken by the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues at its fifth session to continue its work of preparing a compilation of its current practices and methods of work. The decision was also made to appoint Forum members Yuri Boychenko and Parshuram Tamang as special rapporteurs to develop, within existing resources, a questionnaire designed to enhance the reporting of organizations to the Forum. The views of organizations were also requested in that respect. The special rapporteurs were urged to submit proposals on a questionnaire to be discussed at the sixth session of the Forum (see E/2006/43, para. 155).
- 2. The draft questionnaire, which is contained in the annex, follows up a note submitted to the Forum at its fifth session (E/C.19/2006/10). It is also based on experiences of the Forum in receiving some 25 reports annually from United Nations and other intergovernmental organizations, providing information on various aspects of their work regarding indigenous peoples; and on the realization that multi-year efforts are required for the implementation of some accommodations; that agencies cannot immediately implement some recommendations because of a lack of resources and other relevant reasons; and that the mandate of the Forum includes the mainstreaming of these issues within the United Nations system.

Approach

- 3. The proposed questionnaire is meant as a practical tool to facilitate the provision of information by agencies in a way that will improve their dialogue with the Forum and be useful to the agencies, the Forum, Governments and indigenous peoples organizations. It is also meant to improve the monitoring efforts of the Forum and its understanding of obstacles in implementation.
- 4. In preparation of the draft questionnaire, the Department of Economic and Social Affairs also sought input in this respect. The replies received did not contain any information on this point.
- 5. The questionnaire is viewed as work in progress, the text of which should be examined periodically and revised as developments require. The special rapporteurs are looking forward to comments that will further improve the questionnaire.
