Proposed strategic framework for the period 2006-2007

Note by the Secretary-General**

1. The Commission on Sustainable Development has before it for its consideration the present note by the Secretary-General on the preparation of the strategic framework for the period 2006-2007. In this connection, attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 58/269 of 23 December 2003, in which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to prepare, on a trial basis, for submission to the Assembly at its fifty-ninth session, a strategic framework for the biennium 2006-2007, to replace the current four-year medium-term plan, comprising: part one: plan outline; and part two: a biennial programme plan.

2. The attention of the Commission is drawn to rule 104.6 of the Regulations and Rules Governing Programme Planning, the Programme Aspects of the Budget, the Monitoring of Implementation and the Methods of Evaluation (ST/SGB/2000/8):

“The Secretary-General shall take appropriate measures to submit proposals to the sectoral, functional and regional bodies, to enable them to review the relevant portions of the medium-term plan or its revisions with a view to facilitating their consideration by the Committee for Programme and Coordination and the General Assembly.”

3. The Commission is invited to review the proposed biennial programme plan for the subprogramme on sustainable development contained in the annex to the present note and to provide its comments to the Secretary-General. The proposed biennial programme plan, modified as appropriate, will be submitted to the Committee for Programme and Coordination at its forty-fourth session. Its recommendations will be transmitted to the General Assembly at its fifty-ninth session. Also included in the annex are the legislative mandates for the subprogramme.

4. Although the General Assembly decided, in paragraph 9 of resolution 58/269, that the programme narratives of the programme budget fascicles should be identical to those in the biennial programme plan, it is recognized that the outcome of the ten-year review of the implementation of the Barbados Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of the Small Island Developing States, which is to be undertaken at the International Meeting in Mauritius, from 30 August to 3 September 2004, may give rise to revisions in the work programme to be implemented under the subprogramme in 2006-2007. In accordance with paragraph 13 of resolution 58/269, the Committee for Programme and Coordination will review, during the budget year, the programmatic aspects of new and/or revised mandates approved by the Assembly subsequent to the adoption of the biennial programme plan, as well as any differences that may arise between the biennial programme plan and the programmatic aspects of the proposed programme budget.

Subprogramme 7.4 Sustainable development

Objective of the Organization: To advance sustainable development at all levels through the effective and coordinated implementation of Agenda 21, the Programme for the Further Implementation of Agenda 21, the Johannesburg Plan of Implementation and other internationally agreed development goals, including those contained in the United Nations Millennium Declaration and the outcomes of major United Nations conferences relevant to the subprogramme.

Strategy

The Division for Sustainable Development is responsible for the subprogramme. The strategy will include:

(a) Promoting and supporting effective, coherent and coordinated implementation of the sustainable development agenda of the United Nations, including Agenda 21, the Programme for the Further Implementation of Agenda 21 and the Johannesburg Plan of Implementation, as well as the Barbados Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States and the outcomes of the International Meeting to Review the Implementation of the Barbados Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States, at the national, regional and global levels, with an emphasis on greater integration of social, economic and environmental dimensions of sustainable development;

(b) Providing substantive and effective support, including policy development and analysis, to intergovernmental processes, in particular to the Commission on Sustainable Development;

(c) Providing technical and policy advisory services, at the request of Member States, to promote enhanced capacity of developing countries, countries with economies in transition as well as regions in relation to the water and energy sectors and to national sustainable development strategies, information, monitoring and reporting systems;

(d) Strengthening cooperation with major groups and identifying opportunities for their further engagement in the work of the United Nations in the area of sustainable development;

(e) Undertaking in-depth analysis and evaluation of trends in implementation of sustainable development, including lessons learned, best practices and new challenges, and cross-sectoral analysis of sustainable development in the economic and natural resources sectors;

(f) Maintaining and improving a transparent, user-friendly and easily accessible web site, including database systems for information on sustainable development;

(g) Providing information and summary reports on partnerships for sustainable development to the Commission on Sustainable Development.
