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EU contribution for the CSD 15 compilation of national and regional goals and commitments¹

Main objective(s)	Action Plan "Energy policy for Europe":
	- Stresses the need to increase energy efficiency in the EU in order to achieve the objective of saving 20% of the EU's energy consumption compared to projections for 2020;
	- Endorses a binding target of a 20% share of renewable energies in overall EU energy consumption by 2020;
	- Endorses a 10% binding minimum target to be achieved by all Member States for the share of biofuels in overall EU transport petrol and diesel consumption by 2020, introduced in a cost-efficient way. The binding character of this target is appropriate, subject to production being sustainable, second- generation biofuels becoming commercially available and the Fuel Quality Directive being amended accordingly to allow for adequate levels of blending.
	- Stresses the need to integrate energy and development policies, and to address energy access for the poor. This includes to develop a comprehensive Africa-EU Energy Partnership and to leverage different financial instruments such as the 10°x' EDF, the National Indicative Programs, the Energy Facility and the Infrastructure Trust Fund.
	- Stresses the importance of fully exploiting opportunities provided by existing and emerging technologies, in particular those related to energy efficiency and renewable energy

- Welcomes the Commission's initiative to establish a new Global Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy Fund, establishing a public/private partnership to provide equity
