Addendum

Introduction

1. This addendum supplements and updates the information communicated to the fifty-first session of the Commission on Human Rights, which is to be found in the annual report of the Secretary-General to the General Assembly (A/49/484 and Add.1 and Corr.1), and in the annual report of the Secretary-General to the Commission on Human Rights (E/CN.4/1995/33). A list of all contributions and pledges made from the establishment of the Fund up to 3 February 1995 is contained in annex 1; the Fund secretariat will duly correct any errors Governments may find and draw to its attention. A list of humanitarian organizations benefiting from grants allocated from the Fund appears in annex 2. Finally, an excerpt from the statement made by Mr. Jaap Walkate, Chairman of the Fund's Board of Trustees, at the seminar on "The reality of the penitentiary system in Bolivia - problems and prospects" (La Paz, 24 November 1994) is contained in annex 3.

New contributions received

2. The following contributions for 1994/95 have been registered since the publication of document E/CN.4/1995/33 on 28 November 1994:

3. The above table calls for the following comments:

(a) For the second consecutive year, the United States has multiplied the amount of its contribution by 15 with respect to 1992.

(b) As it had done the previous year, Belgium multiplied the amount of its contribution by eight with respect to 1988.

(c) Algeria, Israel and Portugal are new donor States.

(d) The contribution of the Netherlands for 1993, amounting to US\$ 103,248, was omitted from the table in annex 1 of the report to the General Assembly (A/49/484).

(e) Canada, Cyprus, the Netherlands and Switzerland are among the States that contribute to the Fund regularly. The other regular donor countries which made a contribution between the thirteenth session of the Board of Trustees, in May 1994, and 28 November 1994 are: Denmark (\$151,347 for 1994), Hungary (\$500 for 1994), Ireland (\$30,080 for 1994), Luxembourg (\$3,131 for 1994), Monaco (\$15,000 for 1994), Uganda (\$737 for 1994), Sweden (\$475,367 for 1995) and Tunisia (\$1,489 for 1994).

All of the above-mentioned States responded to the appeals made by the Commission on Human Rights in its resolution 1994/36 of 4 March 1994, and by the General Assembly in its resolution 49/176 of 23 December 1994. In these appeals, the Commission and the General Assembly ask all Governments in a

position to do so to respond favourably to requests for contributions to the Fund, if possible on a regular basis and annually before the meeting of the Board of Trustees.

New individual contribution

5. An individual contribution of Can\$ 150 has been received from Mrs. Ethel North (Canada).

Contribution from a non-governmental organization

6. The Friends World Committee for Consultation (Quakers) made a contribution of \$517 to the Fund on 8 December 1994.

Use of contributions

7. It will be recalled that information on the use of contributions received up to the thirteenth session of the Fund's Board of Trustees (17-27 May 1994) is contained in the latest report to the General Assembly (A/49/484), in particular annexes II and V, for the action taken following the Secretary-General's decision to approve the Board's recommendations at its thirteenth session.

Funds needed up to 15 May 1995

8. At its thirteenth session the funds Board of Trustees decided to allocate US\$ 3,700,000 in grants in 1994, while requests amounted to \$4 million.

9. The total contributions received since the thirteenth session and available for allocation at the fourteenth session (15-24 May 1995) amount to \$1,543,495, as against requests already totalling \$5,533,370.

STATEMENT BY JAAP A. WALKATE, AMBASSADOR OF THE NETHERLANDS,
AT THE NATIONAL SEMINAR ON "THE REALITY OF THE PENITENTIARY
SYSTEM IN BOLIVIA - PROBLEMS AND PROSPECTS"
(La Paz, 24 and 25 November 1994)

(Abstract)

The penitentiary system in the light of international norms and rules

Illegal practices must be denounced

It is of the utmost importance that there should never be any doubt in the minds of those who handle detainees or arrested persons that torture or other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment is prohibited by law and that it is approved neither by the government, nor by the law-enforcement bodies.

As Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture, I have come to the conclusion that in our struggle to achieve a humanitarian penitentiary system without infringement of the rights of the detainee, there is nothing so important as the official and unconditional denunciation of such illegal practices. And that denunciation should be made not only by the political authorities, but even more importantly, by every member of the judicial hierarchy, so that it can never be argued that perpetrators of illegal practices at the place of detention were simply employing what they considered to be a lawful instrument of government policy.

A simple text, such as "The Government will tolerate neither torture nor cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment; perpetrators of such acts will be prosecuted", should be displayed in all police stations and places of detention. In cases where law enforcement personnel cannot read, the warning should be made in the form of an oral instruction. I base my suggestion on scientific research which has established that torture and other forms of maltreatment are not ordinary crimes, but "crimes of obedience" (*). A "crime of obedience" has been defined as a crime committed not in opposition to the authorities, but under their explicit instructions. The fact that crimes of obedience take place within a hierarchical structure makes it especially difficult to pinpoint responsibility for them. This fact should not, however, serve as a justification for those who seek to evade their responsibilities under the law within the penitentiary system. The advantage of a clear and unambiguous denunciation as described above is that no one will be able to claim subsequently that they "did not know". It is interesting to note in

this regard that the Bolivian Constitution expressly prohibits "all forms of torture, coercion, extortion, and physical or moral violence on pain of immediate dismissal and without prejudice to such punishment as the law stipulates for those who commit, order, instigate or consent to such acts" (art. 12).

One way of combating this evil would be for the courts at all levels to declare null and void any confession from a detainee obtained through pressure, or even worse, through torture or cruel treatment. Careful study of the files of those convicted could yield information in this respect and could provide sufficient grounds for nullification of a previous conviction.
