

٢- وقام الأمين العام، في الوثيقتين E/CN.4/2002/100 و Add.1 و اللحنة بالترشيحات الخاصة بالمرشحين والمناوبين للانتخاب في اللجنة الفرعية والتي وردت حتى ٢٠ آذار/مارس ٢٠٠١. وقد تضمنت الوثيقتان المذكورتان أيضا البيانات التي وردت عن السيرة الذاتية للمرشحين والمناوبين.
