Adición

1. De conformidad con las resoluciones pertinentes del Consejo Económico y Social, y en especial con la resolución 1986/35, la Comisión de Derechos Humanos ha de proceder, en su 58º período de sesiones, a la elección de la mitad de los miembros de la Subcomisión y de los correspondientes suplentes, si los hubiere, de conformidad con la siguiente distribución: tres miembros de Estados de África, tres miembros de Estados de Asia, un miembro de Estados de Europa oriental, tres miembros de Estados de América Latina y tres miembros de Estados de Europa occidental y otros Estados.
2. En el documento S/E/CN.4/2002/100 y Add.1, el Secretario General puso en conocimiento de la Comisión las candidaturas para la elección de miembros y suplentes de la Subcomisión recibidas hasta el 20 de marzo de 2002. Dicho documento contenía también los datos biográficos de los miembros y de los suplentes propuestos que se habían recibido hasta esa fecha.
