Conclusions and recommendations of special procedures

Report of the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 10(c) of resolution 2004/76, the Commission on Human Rights requested the High Commissioner for Human Rights to continue to prepare a comprehensive and regularly updated electronic compilation of special procedures' recommendations by country, where such does not yet exist, including the relevant comments of States thereto as published within the United Nations system.

2. The compilation is available on the website of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (<u>www.ohchr.ch</u>).

2. In paragraph 12(a) of the same resolution, the Commission on Human Rights requested the Secretary-General to issue annually and sufficiently early, in close collaboration with the special procedures, their conclusions and recommendations, so as to enable further discussion of their implementation at subsequent sessions of the Commission.

In view of United Nations rules prohibiting the republication of material that has already been issued for general distribution, it has been decided to compile in the annex to this report the references to the pertinent chapters containing the conclusions and recommendations of the annual reports submitted to the Commission on Human Rights at its sixty-first session by special procedures. The relevant reports will be posted on the website of the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (www.ohchr.ch) as and when available.
