**Nota verbal de fecha 8 de marzo de 2005 dirigida a la Oficina del Alto  
Comisionado para los Derechos Humanos por la Misión Permanente  
de la República del Sudán ante la Oficina de las Naciones Unidas  
en Ginebra y demás organizaciones internacionales**

La Misión Permanente de la República del Sudán ante la Oficina de las Naciones Unidas en Ginebra y demás organizaciones internacionales saluda atentamente a la Oficina del Alto Comisionado para los Derechos Humanos y, en relación con la nota de la Misión de 4 de junio de 2004 (E/CN.4/2005/G/3) acerca del decreto del Presidente de la República de Sudán sobre la creación de la comisión de Investigación de las denuncias de violaciones de los derechos humanos por grupos armados en Darfur, Sudán occidental, presidida por el ex presidente del

Tribunal Supremo, Daffa Alla El-Haj Yousuf, desearía señalar a la atención de la Oficina que, en aplicación de las recomendaciones de la Comisión de Investigación y en consulta con el Presidente del Tribunal Supremo, la Presidencia de la República ha establecido los siguientes comités\*.

La Misión Permanente de la República del Sudán solicita que se distribuya la presente nota como documento oficial de la Comisión de Derechos Humanos en su 61º período de sesiones, en relación con los temas 3, 4 y 11 *b*) del programa.

The measures, steps and findings of the three Committees to date are as follows:

**A. Findings of the Judicial Investigation Committee:**

After several visits to Darfur three states and several meetings with all concerned, the Committee drew the following conclusions:

1. Regarding Boram events the committee has received sufficient evidence that Justice and Equality Group has committed crimes of killing, robbery, sabotage, war crimes including attacks on areas protected by international law and killing protected groups including the burning alive of wounded persons.
2. In Kass the committee has received sufficient established evidence proving that some individuals have committed killings, burning, rape, forced displacement and torture.
3. Some villagers have deserted their villages in Kass locality because of the attacks against them as well as of fear of imminent attacks. They are still unwilling to return to their homes for lack of security as some of the criminals are still around in their areas.

**B. Damage Assessment Committee:**

The Committee has looked into and decided on 2002 cases in northern Darfur and southern Darfur. The Committee has launched a successful campaign of awareness to encourage people living in Camps to come forward with their complaints. The Committee will visit also Western Darfur. (Elgenina).

**C. Findings of the Administrative Committee:**

The Committee has held meetings in the capital Khartoum as well as in Darfur with concerned authorities, experts and concerned parties. The Committee indicated that corridors, which are used by nomadic tribes to cross from one area to another, are affected by scarcity of water, as well as by development projects and agricultural activities. The Committee advised that more consultation should be pursued with all beneficiaries. The situation is aggravated by drought and desertification in Darfur and land ownership problems. This situation has led to tensions and conflicts between nomadic and sedentary tribes. The Committee has established a Forum for Dialogue in order to facilitate dialogue between all concerned parties. The Committee will continue its work to find ways and means to solve these issues in collaboration with the affected populations and concerned authorities.

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
