STATUS OF THE CONVENTIONS

Note by the Secretary-General

1. At 18 May 2006, the Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and of the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others had been ratified or acceded to by the following 79 States: Afghanistan, Albania, Algeria, Argentina, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Belarus, Belgium, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Djibouti, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Finland, France, Guinea, Haiti, Honduras, Hungary, India, Iraq, Israel, Italy, Japan, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Latvia, Lesotho, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Luxembourg, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mexico, Morocco, Nepal, Niger, Norway, Pakistan, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Korea,
