Draft resolution on the continuity of work in respect of the crime of aggression

Proposal by the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries

The Assembly of States Parties to the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court.

Recalling paragraph 2 of article 5 of the Rome Statute,

Recalling also paragraph 7 of resolution F, adopted in Rome on 17 July 1988 by the United Nations Diplomatic Conference of Plenipotentiaries on the Establishment of an International Criminal Court.

- Takes note with appreciation of the progress report of the Preparatory Commission for the International Criminal Court on the crime of aggression;
- Decides to establish a special working group of the Assembly of States Parties on the crime of aggression, to be open to all States members of the Preparatory Committee;
- Decides also that the special working group shall continue to elaborate proposals for a provision on aggression, including the definition and Elements of Crimes of aggression and the conditions under which the International Criminal Court shall exercise its jurisdiction with regard to this crime. The special working group shall submit such proposals to the Assembly of States Parties at a Review Conference, with a view to arriving at an acceptable provision on the crime of aggression for inclusion in the Statute. The provisions relating to the crime of aggression shall enter into force for the States Parties in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Statute;
- Decides further that the special working group shall meet during the regular sessions of the Assembly of States Parties;
- Requests the Bureau of the Assembly of States Parties to make the necessary arrangements for the meetings of the special working group.
