LETTER DATED 30 JULY 1971 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO THE
PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to inform you that in a letter dated 12 July 1971, the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Sudan, in his capacity as Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the Organization of African Unity, brought to my attention the fact that he had been instructed to request a meeting of the Security Council to be convened on 27 September 1971 to consider the question of Namibia in the light of the Advisory Opinion of 21 June rendered by the International Court of Justice in accordance with Security Council resolution 284 (1970). This request was made in pursuance of resolution 65 (VIII) adopted by the Assembly of Heads of State and Government of the Organization of African Unity at Addis Ababa on 23 June 1971, the text of which appears in document S/10272.

He further informed me that the Chairman of the Assembly of Heads of State and Government of the Organization of African Unity and the Ministers for Foreign Affairs of Ethiopia, Liberia, Nigeria, Sudan and Chad would attend that meeting.
