STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The Security Council met in informal consultations to hear a statement by the Secretary-General in connexion with his report (S/13634) in pursuance of Security Council resolution 435 (1978) and to exchange views on the question of Namibia.

The Security Council expressed its support for the efforts of the Secretary-General to implement Security Council resolution 435 (1978) but noted with grave concern that it had not been possible so far to achieve this.

The Security Council noted that the Front-Line States and SWAPO had accepted the concept of the demilitarized zone and that a South African reaction was still awaited.

The Security Council calls on South Africa to give an urgent reaction concerning an acceptance of the concept of the demilitarized zone, bearing in mind that the General Assembly is to begin its consideration of the question of Namibia on 6 December 1979.
