MALAYSIA

The Government of Malaysia in implementing the previous United Nations resolutions has severed all its relationships with the white racist régime of South Africa and therefore has no relationship of any kind whatsoever with that country. Malaysia has since 1960 banned all imports from South Africa and imposed similar sanctions on all exports to the country since 1965. Malaysia believes that in supporting and giving effect to United Nations resolutions it will be contributing towards the concerted international action intended to dissuade the apartheid régime of South Africa from pursuing inhuman practices.

The Government of Malaysia views operative paragraph 3 of resolutions 2324 (XXII) and 245 (1968) as being aimed at those countries that have relations with the apartheid régime of South Africa and in particular the latter's major trading partners which are in a position to influence the South African régime.

The trial of the South West Africans at Pretoria is a matter of concern to the Netherlands Government. It has therefore appointed an observer who attended the sessions of the court and has been instructed to follow closely further legal proceedings in a higher court.
