The Yemen Arab Republic, faithful to the principles of the Charter of the United Nations and General Assembly resolution 1514 (XV), has always opposed all forms of colonial domination and the criminal policy of apartheid of South Africa and has consistently supported the struggle carried on by the oppressed people to free themselves from the inhuman policy of oppression and to achieve their aspirations of liberty, justice and independence.

The Yemen Arab Republic strongly condemns the illegal trial of the South West African patriots and appeals to all States and international organizations to use their good offices and influence with the South African Government to reverse its verdict and repatriate the persons concerned.

The Yemen Arab Republic has taken in the past and will continue in the future to take all possible measures in full support of the provisions of General Assembly resolution 2324 (XXII) of 16 December 1967 and Security Council resolution 245 (1968) of 25 January 1968. The Yemen Arab Republic believes that it is the responsibility of the Security Council to compel South Africa to fulfil its international obligation by implementing the resolutions and decisions adopted by the United Nations.
