AUSTRALIA

The Australian Government has made representations to the South African Government, through the South African Ambassador in Canberra, affirming the terms of Australian support for General Assembly resolution 2324 (XXII). While it was recognized that pending the establishment of an international administration the South African Government must still exercise responsibility for the maintenance of law and order in South West Africa, it was emphasized that the imposition of harsh penalties by the South African Government on the South West African detainees would damage the international standing of South Africa and sharpen the differences between it and other Members of the United Nations.

ISRAEL

When the matter was discussed in the General Assembly, the delegation of Israel voted in favour of resolution 2324 (XXII). Subsequently, and following resolution 245 (1968) adopted by the Security Council on 25 January 1968, the Government of Israel conveyed to the Government of South Africa its concern at the trial.

LUXEMBOURG

The Luxembourg Government has addressed a note to the South African Embassy expressing its serious concern at the Pretoria trial and has requested the Government of South Africa to observe the provisions of resolution 2324 (XXII), paragraph 2.
