#### REPLIES RECEIVED FROM GOVERNMENTS

#### CHILE

/Original: Spanish/ 25 October 1968

I have the honour to inform you that my Government, faithful to its traditional policy of respect for the principle of the self-determination of peoples, has strictly complied with the General Assembly and Security Council resolutions on the question of Namibia. I should like to add that our participation in the United Nations Council for Namibia is a further confirmation of our firm support for the people of that Territory in their just cause.

#### MAURITIUS

√Original: English√ 12 November 1968

The Government of Mauritius does not have any dealings with the Government of South Africa which help to perpetuate South Africa's illegal occupation of Namibia.

The Permanent Mission of Mauritius would be grateful to the Secretary-General of the United Nations if he could convey to the United Nations Council for Namibia the full moral support of the Government and people of Mauritius in the legitimate struggle of the people of Namibia for independence.
