## Election of seven members of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea

### Note by the Registrar of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea on the election procedures

#### I. Election of seven members of the Tribunal

1. In accordance with article 5, paragraph 1, of the Statute of the Tribunal, the members of the Tribunal shall be elected for nine years and may be re-elected, provided, however, that of the members elected at the first election, the terms of seven members shall expire at the end of three years and the terms of seven more members shall expire at the end of six years.

2. The first election of members of the Tribunal by the Meeting of States Parties was held on 1 August 1996. The seven members whose terms expired at the end of three years and the seven members whose terms expired at the end of six years were determined by the Meeting of States Parties in accordance with the procedure set out in document SPLOS/L.3/Rev.1 of 31 July 1996, consistent with article 5, paragraph 2, of the Statute. Triennial elections of seven members of the Tribunal were held in 1999, 2002, 2005 and 2008.

3. The members presently serving, with an indication of their nationalities and terms of office, are listed in the annex to the present note.

4. The terms of office of the members begin to run from 1 October following the date of the election, in accordance with article 2 of the Rules of the Tribunal.

5. The election to fill the places of seven members whose terms of office expire on 30 September 2011 will take place during the twenty-first Meeting of States Parties, to be held from 13 to 17 June 2011.

6. A list of all persons nominated, in alphabetical order, with an indication of the States Parties which have nominated them, prepared by the Registrar in accordance with article 4, paragraph 2, of the Statute, is being circulated to States Parties in document SPLOS/219. The curricula vitae of the candidates nominated are being circulated in document SPLOS/221.



## II. Procedure

7. Pursuant to article 4, paragraph 4, of the Statute, the members of the Tribunal shall be elected by secret ballot at a meeting of States Parties convened by a procedure agreed to by the States Parties. Two thirds of the States Parties shall constitute a quorum at such meeting. Article 4, paragraph 4, of the Statute further stipulates that the persons elected to the Tribunal shall be those nominees who obtain the largest number of votes and a two-thirds majority of the States Parties present and voting, provided that such majority includes a majority of the States Parties.

8. On 26 June 2009, the nineteenth Meeting of States Parties approved the “Arrangement for the allocation of seats on the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea and the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf”, as contained in document SPLOS/201 (see SPLOS/203, paras. 96-102). According to the approved arrangement, the allocation of seats on the Tribunal shall be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Convention, providing that no regional group will have fewer than three seats. The Meeting also agreed that, from the next election, the Tribunal would have the following composition:

- (a) Five members of the Tribunal shall be from African States;
- (b) Five members of the Tribunal shall be from Asian States;
- (c) Three members of the Tribunal shall be from Eastern European States;
- (d) Four members of the Tribunal shall be from Latin American and Caribbean States;
- (e) Three members of the Tribunal shall be from Western European and other States;
- (f) The remaining one member of the Tribunal shall be elected from among the African States, the Asian States and the Western European and other States.

9. Furthermore, according to the approved arrangement, the above provisions do not prejudice or affect future arrangements for elections.

10. Articles 2 and 3 of the Statute provide as follows:

*“Article 2*

*“Composition*

“1. The Tribunal shall be composed of a body of 21 independent members, elected from among persons enjoying the highest reputation for fairness and integrity and of recognized competence in the field of the law of the sea.

“2. In the Tribunal as a whole the representation of the principal legal systems of the world and equitable geographical distribution shall be assured.

*“Article 3*

*“Membership*

“1. No two members of the Tribunal may be nationals of the same State. A person who for the purposes of membership in the Tribunal could be

regarded as a national of more than one State shall be deemed to be a national of the one in which he ordinarily exercises civil and political rights.

“2. There shall be no fewer than three members from each geographical group as established by the General Assembly of the United Nations.”
