UNCITRAL Digest of case law on the United Nations Convention on the International Sale of Goods*

Article 22

An acceptance may be withdrawn if the withdrawal reaches the offeror before or at the same time as the acceptance would have become effective.

1. Article 22 provides that an offeree may withdraw its acceptance if the withdrawal reaches the offeror before or at the same time as the acceptance becomes effective. An acceptance is effective at the moment it reaches the offeror in accordance with article 18 (2). Article 24 defines when a withdrawal "reaches" the offeror. There are no reported cases applying this article.
