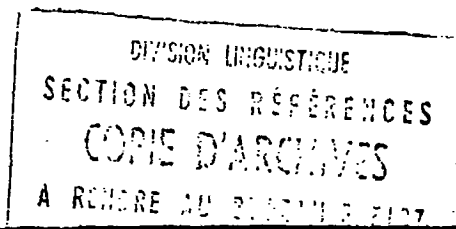

Programme performance of the United Nations for
the biennium 1990-1991Report of the Secretary-General

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I. INTRODUCTION

1. The present report has been prepared within the framework of the Regulations Governing Programme Planning, the Programme Aspects of the Budget, the Monitoring of Implementation and the Methods of Evaluation. These regulations were adopted by the General Assembly in its resolution 37/234 of 21 December 1982. Subsequently, they were issued along with the associated rules as a bulletin of the Secretary-General (ST/SGB/PPBME Rules/1(1987)). Regulation 5.1 states that the Secretary-General shall monitor the delivery of outputs scheduled in the approved programme budget through a central unit in the Secretariat. Regulation 5.2 stipulates that an entire subprogramme shall not be reformulated nor a new programme introduced in the programme budget without the prior approval of an intergovernmental body and the General Assembly. Regulation 5.3 indicates that the biennial programme performance report shall be presented to Member States by the end of the first quarter following the completion of the biennial budget.

2. The report addresses the programme performance of the United Nations for the biennium 1990-1991. As in all previous reports covering earlier bienniums, it measures that performance by comparing the number of final outputs programmed with the number of those implemented. It will be recalled that the General Assembly regularly called for improvements in the monitoring and the reporting of programme performance. Most recently, in compliance with section II of Assembly resolution 45/253 of 21 December 1990, the Secretary-General presented a report to the Assembly at its forty-sixth session through the Committee for Programme and Coordination (CPC) and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) in which he put forward proposals intended to improve the methodology for monitoring and reporting the programme performance of the United Nations (A/46/173). The proposals aimed at rendering the exercise more comprehensive through changes in the format of reporting in order to reflect the diversity of the activities of the Organization. Currently, some of those activities appear in the programme budget for the biennium 1990-1991 as "intermediary" and are not captured in the programme performance report. Furthermore, activities under operational projects are not covered by the exercise owing to the absence of standardized citations for the related outputs. The Secretary-General also proposed to include in the programme performance report an indication of the work-months utilized and to provide a more thorough analysis of the changes that affect the implementation of the work programme.

3. In its consideration of that report, CPC at its thirty-first session acknowledged that the changes proposed were not of a fundamental nature, but could still be a basis for further improvements. ACABQ did not object to the Secretary-General's proposals for improving the monitoring and reporting exercise. It stated its belief that "the goal should be to produce a simplified report to indicate to Member States the extent to which programmes have been modified with an indication of attendant resources". 1/ By section V of its resolution 46/189 of 20 December 1991, the General Assembly took note of the report of the Secretary-General and endorsed the conclusions and recommendations made thereon by CPC and ACABQ.

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4. In terms of content, the present report does not as yet reflect the improvement in coverage proposed in the report of the Secretary-General referred to above. These changes are predicated on the revised format of the programme budget for the biennium 1992-1993 and will therefore take place in the context of the 1992-1993 programme performance reporting exercise. On the other hand, an attempt is made to address one aspect of the new methodology and provide estimates of work-month utilization. In addition, in the addendum to the report, more thorough explanations of the changes and departures from programmed commitments will be provided under each programme.

II. OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMME PERFORMANCE

5. The programme budget for the biennium 1990-1991 comprised a total of 6,237 final outputs. In addition, 774 outputs carried over from the previous bienniums were also due for implementation in 1990-1991, bringing the total of programmed outputs to 7,011. The breakdown of that total by main category was as follows:

The category "Others" comprises activities that do not fall within the standard categories of outputs mentioned in rule 104.4, such as organization of hearings, investigations, studies and consultations, ad hoc meetings, briefings of official visitors and other forms of assistance, responses to government inquiries including legal opinions, conduct of legal proceedings and so on.

6. Of those 7,011 programmed outputs, 5,417 or 77 per cent were actually implemented during the biennium. By category of output, the rate of implementation was as follows:

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7. Annex I, column 9, provides a breakdown of the overall rate of implementation by the 25 major programmes of the medium-term plan for the period 1984-1989, extended to 1991. It ranges from 65 and 68 per cent, in major programmes 23 and 16 respectively, to 85 per cent and over in major programmes 1 and 5, 9, 14 and 25. As in the case of previous bienniums, the overall rate of implementation is considerably affected by the actual delivery of publications, given their weight in the total number of programmed outputs. Thus, the rate of implementation of publications, which represented 56, 60 and 62 per cent of all programmed outputs in major programmes 15, 14 and 23 respectively, has influenced the overall rate of implementation of those major programmes. Similarly, the servicing of meetings and the preparation of reports to intergovernmental bodies, the implementation of which is by definition not left to the discretion of the Secretariat, weighed heavily in the performance of some major programmes that have a relatively high proportion of their activities devoted to servicing meetings and reporting to intergovernmental bodies. This is the case, for instance, in major programme 1, Political and Security Council affairs, where nearly half of the programmed outputs related to such servicing and reporting, and in major programme 4, Political affairs, trusteeship and decolonisation, where the servicing of meetings and reports represented 63 per cent of total outputs implemented.

8. Annex II, also column 9, provides a breakdown of the overall rate of implementation by section of the programme budget. The interpretation of the results for each section is given in the addendum to the present report.

9. In both annexes I and II, as in previous programme performance reports, a distinction is made between outputs implemented as programmed (column 2) and outputs implemented that have been "reformulated" (column 3). An output is considered reformulated when its content as described in the programme budget narrative has been modified, while continuing to address the specific subject-matter of the programme element under which the original output was listed. Quite logically, close to 80 per cent of the reformulated outputs fall under categories of outputs that lend themselves most to reformulations, namely reports and publications. Annex II shows that the reformulation of reports and publications occurred essentially in the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), the Centre for Social Development and Humanitarian Affairs, the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB).

10. Outputs that were not implemented during the biennium were either postponed (703 outputs) or terminated (891 outputs). Together they represented 23 per cent of the total programmed outputs (i.e. 10 per cent were postponed and 13 per cent were terminated). An output is considered "postponed" if, irrespective of its stage of completion, it was not delivered to its primary users during the biennium. The postponed outputs are essentially publications, 77 per cent. Of the 539 postponed publications, 20 per cent originated in the Department of International Economic and Social Affairs and UNEP (10 per cent each), and 18 per cent in the Economic and

Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) and the Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA) (9 per cent each), with the Centre for Social Development and the Centre on Transnational Corporations accounting for 7 per cent each. It is worth noting that 142 publications or 20 per cent of outputs reported postponed were in fact completed during the biennium, but their delivery was delayed for logistical reasons in the area of printing and publishing. This overall level of postponement of programmed outputs is not unusual, especially if examined in conjunction with the number of outputs that were added to the programme budget and implemented during the biennium, as indicated in paragraph 13 below. However, it is worrisome to note (see annex V) that of the 703 outputs postponed, 103 of them, that is, 15 per cent, consisting mostly of publications, had been carried over from previous bienniums in the programme budget of 1990-1991 and were further postponed. The continuing relevance of those outputs in the context of the medium-term plan for the period 1992-1997 ought to be ascertained.

11. If not postponed, the non-implemented outputs have been terminated either by legislative decision - 30 per cent of all terminations - or, more frequently, at the discretion of programme managers in accordance with rule 105.2 of the Regulations and Rules. The 891 outputs terminated during the biennium 1990-1991 represented 13 per cent of outputs programmed. The distribution of all the outputs terminated by category is as follows:

12. The figures given in annex II show that more than half of the terminated outputs were concentrated in UNCTAD, the International Trade Centre UNCTAD/GATT and the regional commissions. The termination of programmed outputs during the biennium 1990-1991 reflects to a large extent the response of legislators and programme managers to political changes and other unforeseen developments. Thus, as a result of the rapidly evolving situation in Central and Eastern Europe during that period, many programmed outputs became obsolete while additional ones had to be introduced. This was of particular significance to activities under major programme 16, International trade and development finance, which accounted for over 20 per cent of total terminated outputs. The programme of work of the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) was also affected by this situation. The events in the Gulf and the resulting cessation of work in the secretariat of ESCWA necessitated the termination of more than one third of its programmed outputs in the biennium. In most other instances, outputs were terminated because they would lose their relevance and effectiveness if carried forward for implementation under the medium-term plan for the period 1992-1997. A case in point is the termination of 254 outputs that have been carried over from previous bienniums. They represented 29 per cent of total terminated outputs.

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13. In addition to the 5,417 outputs that were implemented, a significant number of outputs were added to the programme budget during the biennium and implemented. Such outputs - a total of 477 - were added either by intergovernmental bodies (64 per cent) or at the initiative of the Secretariat (36 per cent). This is, a priori, a normal feature of an active legislative process and reflects the dynamics of implementation of a programme budget. Their distribution by source and category is as follows:

It will be noted that 48 per cent of the 305 supplementary outputs that were added by legislation originated in three regional commissions, namely ECE, ESCAP and ECA. Furthermore, ECE alone accounted for 33 per cent of all the outputs added by legislators, mainly as a result of the need to address the structural changes in the economies of that region.

14. Information by section of the programme budget on the implementation of outputs included within programme elements designated with highest and lowest priority is provided in annexes III and IV. The figures in annex III indicate an overall implementation rate of 80 per cent under highest priority. The implementation was lowest in ESCWA and UNCTAD, which together with the Centre for Social Development and Humanitarian Affairs, ESCAP and the Department of Public Information accounted for 64 per cent of the outputs that were postponed and terminated. Sixty-five per cent of the outputs not implemented were technical publications. The lowest priority designation shown in annex IV reflects an overall implementation rate of 73 per cent, mainly on account of postponements and terminations of publications - 59 per cent.

15. A comparison between the 1988-1989 and 1990-1991 levels of performance is presented in the table below. The number of programmed outputs in the biennium 1990-1991 was substantially lower than that programmed in 1988-1989, partly because of the merger of related activities and outputs under fewer programme elements in the 1990-1991 programme budget and partly as a result of the scaling down of activities relating to Namibia under the terms of General Assembly resolution 44/243 of 11 September 1990. The overall level of implementation was higher in 1990-1991 (77 per cent) than in 1988-1989 (74 per cent), mainly on account of a lower percentage of terminations (12.7 per cent) in 1990-1991 as against 15 per cent in 1988-1989 and to a slight decrease in postponements (10 per cent in 1990-1991 as compared to 11.3 per cent in 1988-1989). However, the implementation of highest priority outputs was lower in 1990-1991 (80 per cent) than in the previous biennium (82 per cent) in the light of the development referred to in paragraph 12 above. The number of outputs added by legislation was higher by 31 per cent

in 1990-1991 from the level in 1988-1989, whereas the number of those added at the initiative of the Secretariat was down by 32 per cent in 1990-1991 from its level in 1988-1989. During the period covered by the report, the vacancy rate averaged 6 per cent in the Professional category for the totality of the Secretariat.

III. RESOURCE UTILIZATION

16. A total of 60,300 work-months, in terms of Professional staff and consultant services, were reported available to programme managers for the production of 7,011 outputs programmed under substantive activities. Of those total work-months, an estimated 17,200 Professional work-months, or 28 per cent, were funded from extrabudgetary resources.

17. Only 60 per cent of the total work-months available, that is, 36,000, were reported utilized for the implementation of the 5,418 outputs reported

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implemented and the 477 added to the programme of work. The balance went to intermediate activities (15 per cent) and substantive support to technical cooperation projects (25 per cent). The outputs added to the programme of work by legislation (305 outputs) or at the initiative of the Secretariat (172 outputs), which together represented 6 per cent of the total outputs programmed in the biennium 1990-1991, have commended 6 per cent of the total work-months utilized.

18. Of the total work-months utilized, 19 per cent was committed for the production of 952 outputs designated as high priority and 5 per cent was committed for the delivery of the 405 implemented outputs designated as low priority. The two rates are commensurate with the proportion of high-priority and low-priority designated outputs in total implementation, namely 18 and 7 per cent respectively.

19. More than two thirds of the work-months funded from extrabudgetary sources were used for support to technical cooperation projects and to operational activities related to the protection and assistance to refugees. The remaining one third - 5,700 work-months - were reported as utilized for the implementation of the substantive programme of work. The proportion of extrabudgetary work-months in the total utilized is as follows:

Quite logically, "Reports" and "Publications", which together accounted for 66 per cent of the total outputs implemented during the biennium, absorbed 58 per cent of the total work-months utilized.
