II. ANALYTICAL PRESENTATION OF REPLIES RECEIVED FROM STATES AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

A. Promotion of the acceptance of and respect for the principles of international law

1. Promoting the acceptance of multilateral treaties

10 bis. The United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) indicated that, as a means of encouraging the acceptance of multilateral treaties and, in particular, the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations, it included in all its agreements with member States concerning the establishment of UNIDO industrial cooperation and investment promotion services a clause confirming the applicability of the above-mentioned Convention to various aspects of the legal relationships contemplated in those agreements.

B. Promotion of means and methods for the peaceful settlement of disputes between States, including resort to and full respect for the International Court of Justice

2. Suggestions by international organizations and bodies and national societies for the promotion of means and methods for the peaceful settlement of disputes between States

31 bis. UNIDO indicated that it encouraged the incorporation, in the Basic Cooperation Agreement which it concluded with member States, of a standard disputes settlement clause providing for an arbitration procedure.

8. Publication by international organizations of treaties concluded under their auspices, publication of the United Nations Treaty Series and the United Nations Juridical Yearbook

90 bis. UNIDO observed that it registered treaties to which it was a party with the Secretariat of the United Nations in accordance with Article 102 of the Charter and that some of those treaties were subsequently published in the United Nations Treaty Series. Moreover, UNIDO contributed every year to the United Nations Juridical Yearbook.
