## Financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi

### Report of the Fifth Committee

#### I. Introduction

1. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 19 September 2008, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-third session the item entitled “Financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi” and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 41st and 55th meetings, on 11 May and 25 June 2009. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee’s consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/63/SR.41 and 55).
3. For its consideration of the item, the Committee had before it the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi (A/63/551) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/63/773).

#### II. Consideration of draft resolution A/C.5/63/L.43

4. At its 55th meeting, on 25 June, the Committee had before it a draft resolution entitled “Financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi” (A/C.5/63/L.43), submitted by the Chairman on the basis of informal consultations coordinated by the representative of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela.
5. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.5/63/L.43 without a vote (see para. 6 below).



### III. Recommendation of the Fifth Committee

6. The Fifth Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

#### **Financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi**

*The General Assembly,*

*Having considered* the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi<sup>1</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>2</sup>

*Recalling* Security Council resolution 1545 (2004) of 21 May 2004, by which the Council authorized, for an initial period of six months as from 1 June 2004, with the intention to renew it for further periods, the deployment of a peacekeeping operation called the United Nations Operation in Burundi, and the subsequent resolutions by which the Council extended the mandate of the Operation, the last of which was resolution 1692 (2006) of 30 June 2006, by which the Council extended the mandate of the Operation until 31 December 2006,

*Recalling also* its resolution 58/312 of 18 June 2004 on the financing of the Operation and its subsequent resolutions thereon, the latest of which was resolution 62/253 of 20 June 2008,

*Reaffirming* the general principles underlying the financing of United Nations peacekeeping operations, as stated in General Assembly resolutions 1874 (S-IV) of 27 June 1963, 3101 (XXVIII) of 11 December 1973 and 55/235 of 23 December 2000,

1. *Takes note* of the status of contributions to the United Nations Operation in Burundi as at 31 March 2009, including the credits in the amount of 49.4 million United States dollars;

2. *Endorses* the conclusions and recommendations contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>2</sup> and requests the Secretary-General to ensure their full implementation;

#### **Disposition of assets**

3. *Takes note* of the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi;<sup>1</sup>

4. *Encourages* Member States that are owed credits for the closed peacekeeping mission accounts to apply those credits to any accounts where the Member State concerned has outstanding assessed contributions;

5. *Urges* all Member States to make every possible effort to ensure the payment of their assessed contributions in full;

6. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its sixty-fourth session the item entitled "Financing of the United Nations Operation in Burundi".
