## Appeal of the participants in the sixth International Children's Festival, "Let's Change the World for the Better", to the Heads of Government and the General Assembly of the United Nations

We, the children of 27 countries, united at the International Children's Centre "Artek" for the sixth International Children's Festival, appeal to you to consider the opinion of children.

We have the same goals, interest and ideas! We are united by art, creativity and friendship! We are not indifferent to what kind of world we are going to live in, but you, adults, determine the future of children on the whole planet.

Our festival unites adults and children. We believe that nowadays the world is lacking in the tolerance and communication that could help us to understand each other better, and that children's rights, while declared, have not been realized.

We believe we could change the world for the better because it is easier for us to find a common language to express our position and to make fast friends forever. Our festival has proven all of this. Today we are making friends, and tomorrow we will join together in making economic, political, cultural and international decisions.

We are devastated by the wars, violence and terror we see on the mass media. The number of homeless children is constantly increasing.

We strongly believe in the need to build more stadiums, sport grounds, art centres and children centres, like "Artek". In that way we can solve at least a small part of the problems and thus contribute to the creation of a world without wars and violence. The best investments are investments in children — since they make the future!

If you adults fulfil even a small part of what we suggest, it will be the first step in changing the world for the better!
