

## **Organization of work**

## Note by the Chairman

- 1. The agenda items allocated by the General Assembly to the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) for consideration are listed in document A/C.4/64/1. Background information on those items, including references to related documentation, is set out in the annotated preliminary list of items to be included in the provisional agenda of the sixty-fourth session (A/64/100) and Add.1).
- 2. The General Assembly, in rule 99, paragraph (b), of its rules of procedure, calls on each Main Committee to adopt a programme of work indicating, if possible, a target date for the conclusion of its work, the approximate dates of consideration of items and the number of meetings to be allocated for the consideration of each item.
- 3. The General Assembly decided that the sixty-fourth session should recess on Tuesday, 15 December 2009, and that, inter alia, the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) should complete its work by Wednesday, 11 November 2009 (see A/64/250, paras. 10 and 11).
- 4. To that end, the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) may wish to consider adopting as a provisional guideline the approximate dates set out below for the consideration of the items on its agenda with the understanding that it may be revised periodically, as appropriate. The Committee will also combine consideration of specific items on its agenda in order to ensure full and efficient utilization of the conference facilities allocated to it. As indicated below, conference services has allocated 27 meetings to the Committee and has urged the Committee to make every effort to complete its work within the allotted time. Should the Committee wish to change the dates for consideration of items, it would still have to work within the dates and times indicated below.

- 5. The above timetable is a new version of the proposed programme of work and timetable approved by the Committee (see A/63/409) which has been revised in order to rearrange some items. The Chairman wishes to draw the attention of members of the Committee to the following:
- (a) In accordance with established procedures and practices and bearing in mind the availability of documentation, the Committee may wish to hold one general debate covering agenda items 35 to 39, and individual debates on agenda items 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 118 and 133 on the understanding that draft resolutions and/or decisions will be considered separately;
- (b) Representatives of Non-Self-Governing Territories and petitioners will be heard as early as possible during the Committee's consideration of the related items, and the Chairman suggests that the Committee devote its meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday, 6 and 7 October, to the hearing of petitioners;
- (c) Item 118, "Revitalization of the work of the General Assembly", is allocated to all the Main Committees for the sole purpose of considering and taking action on their respective tentative programme of work;
- (d) Item 133, "Programme planning", is allocated to all the Main Committees and the plenary of the General Assembly to enhance discussion of evaluation, planning, budgeting and monitoring reports. If the Assembly allocates any report submitted under this item to the Fourth Committee, the Committee shall revert to this item.

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- 6. Subject to the above provisional programme of work being acceptable to the Committee and in order to facilitate its work, the Chairman wishes to suggest that the list of speakers in the general debate covering agenda items 35 to 39 be closed on Monday, 5 October, at 6 p.m. The Committee will take decisions on the closure of the list of speakers relating to the general debates on the remaining items at the appropriate time.
- 7. The Chairman also wishes to draw the attention of members of the Committee to the decisions of the General Assembly on the organization of its work contained in document A/64/250, sections II.B to III.
- 8. Members are also requested to bear in mind the decision of the General Assembly that morning and afternoon meetings should start promptly at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., both for all plenary meetings and for meetings of the Main Committees during the sixty-fourth session. The attention of the Members is also drawn to the Assembly's decision to waive, at its sixty-fourth session, the quorum required, under rule 108 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, for the Chairman to declare a meeting open and permit the debate to proceed (see A/64/250, paras. 12 and 15).
- 9. In view of the limited number of meetings available to the Committee, it is suggested that the time limit for statements be set at 10 minutes, with the exception of statements made by the spokespersons of groups of delegations, which would be extended to 15 minutes. In this connection, the Chairman will set up the time limit for the petitioners as it is deemed necessary.
- 10. In order to allow the distribution of prepared texts of statements made in the Committee to delegations, the specialized agencies, observers, interpreters and record-writers, 300 copies are required. A minimum of 30 copies should be given in advance of delivery of the statement in order to help the Secretariat to provide the best possible service.
- 11. The list of documents submitted under the various agenda items allocated to the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) is contained in document A/C.4/64/INF/1, which will be updated as necessary.

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
