# CONFERENCE ON DISARMAMENT CD/1627

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REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE ON DISARMAMENT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

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#### I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Conference on Disarmament submits to the fifty-fifth session of the United Nations General Assembly its annual report on its 2000 session, together with the pertinent documents and records.

#### II. ORGANIZATION OF WORK OF THE CONFERENCE

#### A. 2000 Session of the Conference

2. The Conference was in session from 17 January to 24 March, 22 May to 7 July and 7 August to 22 September 2000. During this period, the Conference held 25 formal plenary meetings, at which member States as well as non-member States invited to participate in the discussions outlined their views and recommendations on the various questions before the Conference.

3. The Conference also held 7 informal meetings on its agenda, programme of work, organization and procedures, as well as on items of its agenda and other matters.

4. In accordance with rule 9 of the rules of procedure, representatives of the following member States assumed successively the Presidency of the Conference: Austria, Bangladesh, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil and Bulgaria.

#### B. Participants in the Work of the Conference

5. The representatives of Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Bangladesh, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cameroon, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Cuba, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Myanmar, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nigeria, Norway, Pakistan, Peru, Poland, Republic of Korea, Romania, Russian Federation, Senegal, Slovakia, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Switzerland, Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Venezuela, Viet Nam and Zimbabwe participated as Member States in the work of the Conference.

#### C. Agenda and Programme of Work for the 2000 Session

6. At the 837th plenary meeting on 18 January 2000, the Conference adopted its agenda for the 2000 session in conformity with the rules of procedure. The agenda (CD/1603) reads as follows:

"Taking into account, <u>inter alia</u>, the relevant provisions of the Final Document of the First Special Session of the General Assembly devoted to disarmament, and pending the conclusion of its consultations on the review of its agenda, and without prejudice to their outcome, the Conference adopts the following agenda for its 2000 session:

- 1. Cessation of the nuclear arms race and nuclear disarmament.
- 2. Prevention of nuclear war, including all related matters.
- 3. Prevention of an arms race in outer space.
- 4. Effective international arrangements to assure non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons.
- New types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons; radiological weapons.
- 6. Comprehensive programme of disarmament.
- 7. Transparency in armaments.
- Consideration and adoption of the annual report and any other report, as appropriate, to the General Assembly of the United Nations."

7. After the adoption of the agenda, the President made the following statement: "In connection with the adoption of the agenda, I, as the President of the Conference, should like to state that it is my understanding that if there is a consensus in the Conference to deal with any issues, they could be dealt with within this agenda".

8. During the annual session, successive Presidents of the Conference conducted intensive consultations with a view to reaching consensus on the programme of work. Their proposals, either formal or informal, were considered during those consultations. The Conference did not, however, agree on the programme of work and did not re-establish or establish any mechanism on any of its specific agenda items during the 2000 session.

9. In addition to the official documents listed below, some informal proposals related to the programme of work were also put forward by the Presidents of the Conference on Disarmament.

10. The Conference had before it the following official documents:

(a) CD/1620, dated 29 June 2000, entitled "Proposal by the President on the Programme of Work for the 2000 session of the Conference on Disarmament";

11. Also, during plenary meetings of the Conference, delegations and groups of delegations expressed their views on this issue. These are duly reflected in plenary records.

D. Attendance and Participation of States not Members of the Conference

12. In conformity with rule 32 of the rules of procedure, the States not members of the Conference listed under the following paragraph attended its plenary meetings.

13. The Conference received and considered requests for participation in its work from 41 States not members of the Conference. In accordance with the rules of procedure and its decision taken at its 1990 session on its improved and effective functioning (CD/1036), the Conference invited the following non-member States to participate in its work: Albania, Angola, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Brunei Darussalam, Costa Rica, Côte d'Ivoire, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Gabon, Georgia, Ghana, Greece, Holy See, Iceland, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malta, Mauritius, Nepal, Oman, Philippines, Portugal, Qatar, Republic of Moldova, San

Marino, Singapore, Slovenia, Sudan, Thailand, The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Uruguay and Zambia.

#### E. Expansion of the Membership of the Conference

14. The importance of the expansion of the membership of the Conference was addressed by delegations in plenary meetings.

15. Requests for membership had been received, since 1982, from the following 21 non-members, in chronological order: Greece, Croatia, Kuwait, Portugal, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Costa Rica, Denmark, The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Cyprus, Lithuania, Ghana, Luxembourg, Uruguay, Philippines, Azerbaijan, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Armenia, Thailand, Georgia and Jordan.

#### F. Review of the Agenda of the Conference

16. The importance of the review of the agenda of the Conference was addressed by delegations in plenary meetings.

#### G. Improved and Effective Functioning of the Conference

17. The importance of the improved and effective functioning of the Conference was addressed by delegations in plenary meetings.

#### H. Communications from Non-Governmental Organizations

18. In accordance with rule 42 of the rules of procedure, a list of all communications from non-governmental organizations and persons was circulated to the Conference (document CD/NGC/34).

#### III. SUBSTANTIVE WORK OF THE CONFERENCE DURING ITS 2000 SESSION

19. The substantive work of the Conference during its 2000 session was based on its agenda. The list of documents issued by the Conference, as well as the texts of those documents, are included as appendix I to the report. An index of the verbatim records by country and subject, listing the statements made by delegations during 2000, and the verbatim records of the meetings of the Conference, are attached as appendix II to the report.

20. The Conference had before it a letter dated 14 January 2000 from the Secretary-General of the United Nations (CD/1602) transmitting all the resolutions dealing with or related to disarmament and international security adopted by the General Assembly at its fifty-fourth session in 1999, including those making specific reference to the Conference on Disarmament:

21. At its 837th plenary meeting on 18 January 2000 the Secretary-General of the Conference and Personal Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General conveyed to the Conference a message from the Secretary-General of the United Nations at the opening of the 2000 session (CD/PV.837).

A. Cessation of the Nuclear Arms Race and Nuclear Disarmament

22. During plenary meetings of the Conference, delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on this agenda item, including on nuclear disarmament and on the prohibition of the production of fissile material for nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices. These are duly recorded in the plenary records of this session.

23. In addition to the documents listed in paragraph 10 above, the following documents dealing with this item were submitted to the Conference:

(a) CD/1609, dated 24 March 2000, entitled "Resolution on nuclear disarmament adopted by the New Zealand Parliament, 23 February 2000", submitted by the delegation of New Zealand;

#### B. Prevention of Nuclear War, including all Related Matters

24. During plenary meetings of the Conference, some delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the agenda item, and these are recorded in plenary records, previous annual reports of the Conference (in particular paragraphs 62-71 of the 1992 report to the General Assembly of the United Nations (CD/1173)), related official documents and working papers.

#### C. Prevention of an Arms Race in Outer Space

25. In addition to the documents listed in paragraph 10 above, the following document dealing with this item was submitted to the Conference:

(a) CD/1606, dated 9 February 2000, entitled "Letter dated 9 February 2000 from the Permanent Representative of China to the Conference on Disarmament addressed to the Secretary-General of the Conference transmitting a working paper entitled "China's position on and suggestions for ways to address the issue of prevention of an arms race in outer space at the Conference on Disarmament".

26. During plenary meetings of the Conference, delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the agenda item. These are duly recorded in the plenary records of this session.

## D. <u>Effective International Arrangements to Assure Non-Nuclear-Weapon</u> States Against the Use or Threat of Use of Nuclear Weapons

27. Although no new documents were submitted to the Conference specifically under the agenda item during the 2000 session, the documents listed in paragraph 10 above dealt, <u>inter alia</u>, with this item.

28. During plenary meetings of the Conference, delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the agenda item. These are duly recorded in the plenary records of this session.

### E. <u>New Types of Weapons of Mass Destruction and New Systems</u> of Such Weapons; Radiological Weapons

29. During plenary meetings of the Conference, some delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the agenda item, and these are recorded in plenary records, previous annual reports of the Conference (in particular paragraphs 79-82 of the 1992 report of the Conference to the General Assembly of the United Nations (CD/1173)), related official documents and working papers.

#### F. Comprehensive Programme of Disarmament

30. During plenary meetings of the Conference, some delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the agenda item, and these are recorded in plenary records, previous annual reports of the Conference (in particular paragraphs 83-89 of the 1992 report to the General Assembly of the United Nations (CD/1173)), related official documents and working papers.

31. During plenary meetings of the Conference, a number of delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the issue of anti-personnel landmines, the detailed descriptions of which were duly recorded in the plenary records of this session.

32. In addition to the documents listed in paragraph 10 above, the following document dealing with the issue of anti-personnel landmines was submitted to the Conference:

#### G. Transparency in Armaments

During plenary meetings of the Conference, delegations reaffirmed or further elaborated their respective positions on the agenda item. These are duly recorded in the plenary records of this session.

## H. <u>Consideration of Other Areas Dealing with the Cessation of the</u> Arms Race and Disarmament and Other Relevant Measures

35. During its 2000 session, the Conference also had before it the following documents:

## I. Consideration and Adoption of the Annual Report of the Conference and any other Report as Appropriate to the General Assembly of the United Nations

36. To promote substantive progress during the 2001 session, the Conference requested the current President and the incoming President to conduct appropriate consultations during the intersessional period and to make recommendations, if possible, that could help to commence early work on various agenda items, recognizing the support of the Conference for CD/1624 as a basis for further intensified consultations. These consultations shall, inter alia, take into account proposals and views presented and discussions held in the 2000 session.

37. The Conference decided that the dates for its 2001 session would be:

<u>First part</u> :	22	January-30 March 2001
Second part:	14 1	May-29 June 2001
Third part:	30	July-14 September 2001

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38. The annual report to the fifty-fifth session of the General Assembly of the United Nations, as adopted by the Conference on 21 September 2000, is transmitted by the President on behalf of the Conference on Disarmament.
