The Syrian Mission requests that the letter be issued as an official document of the Conference on Disarmament.

I am writing to you in response to your invitation to the delegations to the Conference on Disarmament to propose subjects for discussion at the 2007 session of the Conference.

The delegation of the Syrian Arab Republic should like to propose the subject of Israel's use of cluster munitions and phosphorus bombs against Lebanese civilians during the Israeli war against Lebanon in July and August 2006.

The Israeli army has admitted to having made wide use of these weapons against Lebanese civilians. An Israeli army general told the Israeli newspaper *Haaretz*, on 12 September 2006, that the Israeli army had dropped around 1,800 cluster bombs containing over 1.2 million bomblets. Israeli soldiers confirm that the Israeli army used phosphorus shells during the war: the use of such shells is prohibited under international law.

The delegation of the Syrian Arab Republic requests that this matter be discussed under the agenda item entitled "Transparency in armaments" and that the present letter be issued as an official document of the Conference on Disarmament.
