

## Joint Statement by the Russian Federation and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela

The Russian Federation and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela,

**Noting** the significance of outer space activities as a major factor in the socioeconomic, scientific and technical development of States and their role in national and international security;

**Believe** that outer space should be used in accordance with international law for the benefit of all peoples, irrespective of their level of economic, scientific and technical development;

**Reaffirm** their commitment to the principle set out in Article 2 of the Charter of the United Nations, which establishes that Member States should refrain in their international relations from the threat or use of force, including in outer space activities, and proceed from the assumption that all States will strictly comply with this provision;

**Emphasize** that one of the international community's key priorities is to conclude an international treaty to prevent an arms race and to prohibit the deployment or use of weapons in outer space;

**Hereby state** that they will not be the first to deploy any type of weapon in outer space and will do their utmost to prevent outer space from being turned into a theatre for military confrontation and to ensure security in outer space activities. The Russian Federation and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela urge all States with space capabilities to follow their example.
