Addendum

1. In its resolution **35/81** of 5 December 1980, the General Assembly requested the Director-General for Development and **International Economic Cooperation** to submit annually a report containing comprehensive statistical information **on** operational activities for development of the United Nations system.

2. Preliminary **statistical information for 1988** and 1989 were provided in documents **A/44/324/Add.4-E/1991/106/Add.4** and **A/45/273/Add.4-E/1990/85/Add.4**. Complete statistical data including revision of some figures previously published, are now being made available to Member States.

OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES IN THE UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM IN 1989:
A QUICK GUIDE


1. Various kinds of **resource** flows, domestic and external, public and private, commercial and charitable, serve to promote the economic and social advancement of developing countries. Of these, official development assistance (**ODA**) is an important element which **serves** as a barometer of development cooperation and is channelled through bilateral and multilateral institutions. In 1989, it totalled \$53.1 billion **as** net ODA expenditures by donors. **a/** About 12.5 per cent of total ODA was provided in concessional flows through the organisations of the United Nations system, divided almost equally between development-related grants (6.5 per cent) and concessional loans (6.0 per cent). (See table B-1.) **a/**

2. As indicated in detail in the present document, expenditures on operational activities through the United Nations system comprise: development-related **grants**; concessional loans; non-concessional **loans**; and refugee, humanitarian and special economic **assistance** and disaster relief. These totalled about \$4.3 billion in 1989. (For loan expenditures, only net transfers were counted.) This was composed of development grants \$3.4 billion, concessional **loans** \$3.2 billion, non-concessional loans minus \$3.2 billion and grant-financed refugee, humanitarian, special economic and disaster relief activities \$0.9 **billion**. (See chart 2 and table 3-1.)

87.5%





3. The operational activities of the United Nations system in the largest sense include all of the above. A distinction should be made, however, in the grant-assistance category between development-oriented activities and humanitarian and relief assistance provided by UNHCR, UNRWA and UNDRO. These two forms of grant assistance should be distinguished from non-concessional and concessional loans provided by the World Bank, including its IDA facility, and IFAD. b/

4. Another important analytical distinction is to group the concessional loans and development grants of the system and to designate these as net transfers of concessional assistance for development. The total came to \$6.56 billion in 1989, of which \$5.9 billion was for individual recipient countries. Development grants comprised over half of these amounts. (See table B-3.)

5. Geographically, over four fifths of all the concessional resources in 1989 were allocated to Africa and the Asia and Pacific regions. Activities in Latin America and the Caribbean, in Western Asia, and in the "interregional, global and other" category accounted for virtually all the rest. (See table B-4.)


THE COMPOSITION OF

(Excluding non-concessional loans)





6. The United Nations **system's** strong focus on **assistance** to the poorest countries is quite evident. About 46 **per** cent of all concessional development **assistance** (including grants) in 1989 **was** provided to **countries** classified as

"least-developed". About one third of the total concessional assistance was for countries where the gross national product (**GNP**) per capita **was** \$250 or below; a total of almost one half **was** for those where GNP per capita did not exceed \$500. In 1989, IDA net transfers amounted to \$3.0 billion (i.e., more than half of the total concessional **assistance** to individual countries). Of that, one third **was** devoted to countries where GNP per capita did not exceed \$250 and over one half to those where GNP per capita **was** between \$251 and \$500. (See table B-7.)


7. Inclusion of the demographic factor permits yet another perspective on the distribution of the system's concessional development assistance. Overall, these resources amounted to \$1.11 per capita in 1989. In the poorest countries the figure **was** much higher, at \$2.03 per capita. (See table B-8.)

8. Turning now to grant assistance for development, this represents both financial contributions through a range of institutions and the food aid for development projects channelled through **WFP**. The Resident Coordinator of Operational Activities for Development of the United Nations System **assumes** overall leadership in the organisation of such assistance at the country level, as well as of some relief activities. As indicated in paragraph 1, in 1989 the total grant contribution represented 6.5 per cent of total ODA.

9. The distribution of grant expenditure⁵ in support of development activities in 1989 was: **UNDP**, including DNDP-administered funds, \$981 million, **WFP** \$761 million, extrabudgetary (XB) including agency trust funds and Government "self-supporting" funds \$749 million, **UNICEF** \$501 million, regular budget (RB) \$246 million, and **UNFPA** \$157 million. (See tables B-2 and B-5.)

10. Over 60 per cent of 1989 country-level expenditures benefited from integrated general policy and management advice from the **UNDP** resident representative, who also serves as the official field representative for **WFP** and **UNFPA**. The UNDP Governing Council - holding review authority for the **UNDP main programme**, UNDP-administered funds and **UNFPA** - was responsible in 1989 for monitoring the expenditure of 33 per cent of such development activities. 
THE PRINCIPAL CHANNELS OF GRANT - FUNDED ACTIVITIES FOR DEVELOPMENT, 1989




11. The sectoral coverage of the system's grant-funded development assistance is wide-ranging, but with strong emphasis upon the health, the agriculture/forestry/fisheries humanitarian aid and relief programme classification categories. Other areas of importance in 1989 included general development issues, policy and planning, natural resources, industry; population, transport and communications, education, science and technology, and employment. (See table 'B-5.')

12. The application of the term "technical cooperation" to the analysis of operational activities leads to a somewhat different demarcation, in which the food aid of WFP is excluded, but the expenditures on training and consultants included in World Bank loans and IDA credits are included. Such use of World Bank/IDA funds is estimated to have amounted to \$1.1 billion gross disbursements in 1989. (See memo item, table B-1.) According to this formulation, total United Nations system technical cooperation expenditures were \$3.8 billion, distributed among World Bank/IDA, UNDP and UNDP-administered funds, XB, UNICEF, RB and UNFPA. It should be noted that while World Bank/IDA technical cooperation-type expenditures are larger than those of UNDP, they are made through loans and credits to Governments and represent, on the whole, integral parts of specific investment projects.

THE PRINCIPAL CHANNELS OF 'TECHNICAL COOPERATION' INCLUDING WORLD BANK/IDA, 1989




13. Implementation of the grant-financed development activities was undertaken by 28 organizations and agencies of the system, together with Governments, borne NGOs and other non-United Nations entities. The major channels for such expenditures in 1989 were: WFP (\$761 million); g/ UNICEF (\$504 million); FAO (\$368 million); g/ WHO (\$357 million); DTCD (\$156 million); UNDP (\$145 million); ILO (\$140 million); UNIDO (\$128 million); UNESCO (\$80 million); World Bank (\$62 million); ICAO (845 million) and IAEA (\$41 million). Government (national) execution amounted for \$146 million. The total for all other agencies was \$470 million. (See table B-5.)

14. UNDP (including the UNDP-administered funds) has a central funding and coordinating role for technical cooperation within the United Nations system, and to this effect maintains strong linkages with the relevant agencies on substantive aspects of its work. In addition, the United Nations agencies are responsible for the execution of 73 per cent of UNDP-funded programmes. UNFPA, though focused on one sector, also channels its expenditures through a dozen United Nations agencies, as well as Governments; it also undertakes direct execution for some 17 per cent of its expenditures.

15. Twenty-four organisations of the United Nations system are executing agencies for UNDP. Five of these agencies, plus Governments and UNDP itself, delivered at least \$57 million of UNDP main programme resources in 1989. Their shares of the total delivery for UNDP were: FAO

SHARES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF GRANT-FUNDED ACTIVITIES FOR DEVELOPMENT, 1989




\$164 million (19 per cent), DTCD
\$100 million (11 per cent), UNDP

\$61 million (7 per cent), World Bank
\$57 million (7 per cent). The total of all other⁸ amounted to \$221 million (25 per cent). (See table B.5.)

16. UNDP and UNDP-administered funds financed 44 percent of the technical cooperation expenditures of 23 of the above 24 United Nations system organisations in 1987. When expenditures for UNFPA are added, the result is that the Governing Council had within its purview, for these 23 institutions, the funding of 50 per cent of their expenditure⁸ on operational activities, for a total of \$785 million.

17. At the same time, the significance of the UNDP central funding role, and of the UNDP Governing Council, must be seen in relation to both the volume and the distribution of RB and XB expenditures. Taken together, these expenditures, which are implemented according to the mandate and procedures of each agency, are greater than the resources managed by UNDP. WHO is mandated to devote at least 60 per cent of its regular budget resources to development cooperation, and has by far the largest RB programme. That of IAEA represents an even greater proportion of its expenditures on technical cooperation. FAO and WHO also have major XB support. The combination of RB and XB expenditures for WHO, IAEA and FAO was \$536 million in 1989, representing 77 per cent of the total disbursed through those three agencies.

18. UNICEF is a special case. Although a self-funding agency, it received in 1989 UNDP-administered resources in the amount of \$3 million. Its greeting card⁸ resources amounted to \$49.2 million in 1989. (See memo item table A-1.)

NOTE ON STATISTICAL INFORMATION

General note

1. Coverage, definition and sources for the figure8 used in this report are consistent with those for previous years' report8 in this series. Modification8 have been made to data presentation, column heading8 and table titles in the interest of greater clarity and internal consistency. Explanation8 of special cases, or of instances in which table total8 do not match, have been given attention in the footnote8 to tables.

Definitions and explanations

2. For information on the sources of data, see paragraph 45 of the first (1981) annual report (A/36/478, annex) and the footnote8 to the tables.

3. The data represent final figure8 for 1988 and 1989. Should any further revisions or updating later prove necessary, this would be communicated to the General Assembly.

4. Data on contributions refer to contribution8 received from Governments and other sources by organizations in the United Nations system. Data on other income, related to resource transfers from one agency of the system to another, interest, etc., or the net profits from the UNICEF greeting card operation, are excluded. Data on XpOnditUrOe and disbursements represent the support provided by organizations to the programmes and project8 of developing countries; administrative, programme and other support costs, where identifiable, are excluded. UNICEF and WFP carry out both development assistance and some activities which are of a humanitarian or emergency character. To the extent possible, the related contributions and expenditures are separately identified. With regard to loans, net disbursements represent gross disbursements less repayment of principal2 net transfers represent net disbursement8 less interest and other charges.

5. The expression "United Nations funds and programmes" refers to the funds and programme8 listed by the General Assembly for participation in the annual United Nation8 Pledging Conference for Development Activities, and to other United Nation8 trust fund8 pertaining to development activities.

6. The designations employed and the presentation of the material in the present report do not imply the expression of any opinion whatsoever on the part of the Secretariat of the United Nations concerning the legal status of any country, territory, city or area or of its authorities, or concerning the delimitation of its frontiers or boundaries.

7. The term "country" as used in the present report also refers, as appropriate, to territories or areas.

8. References to dollars (\$) are to United States dollars unless otherwise stated. A full stop is used to indicate decimals. Two dots (..) indicate that data are not available or are not separately reported. Parentheses () indicate a deficit or increase, except as otherwise indicated. A dash (-) indicates that the amount is nil or negligible or the item is not applicable. A hyphen (-) between dates representing years signifies the full period involved, including the beginning and end years.

9. Details and percentages in tables do not necessarily add to totals, because of rounding.

United Nations system: the picture in 1989**






Chart 2. Expenditures on operational activities for development of the United Nations system: the picture in 1989

(Millions of US dollars)


