## Election of nine members of the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights

### Note by the Secretary-General

1. By its resolution 1985/17, the Economic and Social Council decided to establish a Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights to undertake functions relating to the implementation of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights and to assist the Council in fulfilling its responsibilities under the Covenant. The members are elected from a list of persons nominated by States parties to the Covenant.
2. In 2008, the Council is to elect nine members of the Committee for a four-year term beginning on 1 January 2009 to fill vacancies that will occur upon the expiration, on 31 December 2008, of the terms of the following members: Mohamed Ezzeldin Abel-Moneim (Egypt), Rocío Barahona Riera (Costa Rica), Andrzej Rzeplinski (Poland), Sergei N. Martynov (Belarus), Ariranga Govindasamy Pillay (Mauritius), Waleed M. Sa'di (Jordan), Philippe Texier (France), Barbara Wilson (Switzerland) and Zhan Daode (China).
3. In a note verbale dated 12 November 2007, the Secretary-General invited States parties to the Covenant to submit their nominations for membership in the Committee within three months. The names of the persons nominated are set out below, together with the States parties that nominated them. Biographical information on the candidates will be issued in document E/2008/9/Add.11.
