Statement

It has been adopted, as a matter of general Principle that the pillars of Sustainable Development are: (1) Integrative Economic Growth; (2) Social Justice; and, (3) Environmental Protection.

In the practice, however, there are more said than done. The simple reason is, in every level of human life, the conscious link of human activities toward higher vision lacks sustaining and consistent Civil Magnanimity. The focus should be: Life on Earth is the centre of human activities: “the quest for an ideal way of sustaining Life on Earth.” This is a global concern and calls for global civil response. The process of global sustainable development was perceived by the UN by the Eight (8) MDGs which envisions developmental enfoldment in various fields and level, which are like moving circles that are link together by the ebb and flow of energy forces they generate directed towards peace, order and justice. These circles of life starts in the personal and individual levels, the Family and homes, religious institutions and schools, duly organized governments and civil societies, who are all inspired and cohesively moved by a common Vision.
