### Annotations

#### Item 1. Election of officers

1. Rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council (E/5975/Rev.1) provides that, at the commencement of the first meeting of a regular session, the Commission shall elect, from among the representatives of its members, a Chairman, one or more Vice-Chairmen and such other officers as may be required. At the first session, the Commission elected, in addition to a Chairman, four Vice-Chairmen, one of whom served also as Rapporteur.

2. The membership of the Commission in 1994 is given in annex II below.

#### Item 2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

3. Rule 7 of the rules of procedure provides that the Commission shall, at the beginning of each session, after the election of its officers, adopt the agenda for that session on the basis of the provisional agenda.

4. In decision 1993/314, the Economic and Social Council approved the provisional agenda for the second session of the Commission.

#### Item 3. General discussion on progress in the implementation of Agenda 21, focusing on the cross-sectoral components of Agenda 21 and the critical elements of sustainability

5. At its first session, the Commission requested the Secretary-General to prepare an annual overview report on progress made in the implementation of Agenda 21, which should focus on the cross-sectoral components of Agenda 21 and the critical elements of sustainability and should contain an analysis of progress made, the main trends and the main problems countries face in the implementation of Agenda 21 (E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, para. 28 (a)).

6. In 1994, in accordance with the multi-year thematic programme of work adopted by the Commission at its first session, the focus of the cluster entitled "Critical elements of sustainability" is to be chapters 2 and 4 of Agenda 21 (see E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, sect. A, annex, sect. II.A).

#### Item 4. Financial resources and mechanisms

7. At its first session, recognizing its mandate to review the adequacy of the financial resources available for the implementation of Agenda 21, the Commission decided to establish an Inter-sessional Ad Hoc, Open-ended Working

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Group on Finance to assist it in its work (E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, para. 61). The Working Group met from 28 February to 2 March 1994. The Commission will have before it the report of the Working Group.

Item 5. Education, science, transfer of environmentally sound technologies, cooperation and capacity-building

8. In 1994, in accordance with the Commission's multi-year thematic programme of work, the focus of the cluster entitled "Education, science, transfer of environmentally sound technologies, cooperation and capacity building" is to be chapters 34 and 37 of Agenda 21 (see E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, sect. A, annex, sect. II.C)

9. At its first session, recognizing its mandate to review progress concerning the transfer of environmentally sound technologies, cooperation and capacity-building for the implementation of Agenda 21, the Commission decided to establish an Inter-sessional Ad Hoc, Open-ended Working Group on Technology Transfer and Cooperation to assist it in its work (E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, para. 50). The Working Group met from 23-25 February 1994. The Commission will have before it the report of the Working Group.

Item 6. Review of sectoral clusters, first phase (a) Health, human settlements and freshwater (b) Toxic chemicals and hazardous wastes

10. In accordance with its multi-year thematic programme of work, the Commission is to consider the following sectoral clusters in 1994: (a) health, human settlements and freshwater; and (b) toxic chemicals and hazardous wastes (E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, sect. A, annex, sect. II.I).

11. At its first session, the Commission requested the Secretary-General to prepare thematic reports, corresponding to the Agenda 21 sectoral clusters to be

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included in the agendas of forthcoming sessions of the Commission, in accordance with its multi-year thematic programme of work (E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, para. 28 (b)).

Item 8. High-level meeting

12. In resolution 47/191, the General Assembly recommended that the Commission, at its first substantive session, adopt a multi-year thematic programme of work, including a high-level meeting, with ministerial participation, to have an integrated overview of the implementation of Agenda 21, to consider emerging policy issues and to provide necessary political impetus to the implementation of the decisions of the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development and the commitments contained therein.

13. At its first session, the Commission decided that, as a rule, its high-level meetings should last for a period of up to three days and that they should be integral parts of the session of the Commission and of its decision-making process. The organization of work of the high-level meetings should, inter alia, provide for an open exchange of views among the participants, as well as for holding informal meetings, as the need arose, to resolve outstanding issues related to its work that required high-level consideration. The result of the meeting could be a concise document, should the participants deem that appropriate.

14. Also at its first session, the Commission recommended that the report of the High-level Advisory Board on Sustainable Development, containing its expert advice on issues relating to the implementation of Agenda 21, be submitted to the Commission through the Secretary-General (E/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, para. 17).

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Item 9. Provisional agenda for the third session of the Commission

15. In accordance with rule 9 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council, the Secretary-General shall submit a draft provisional agenda for the Commission's forthcoming session, indicating in respect of each agenda item the documents to be submitted under that item and the legislative authority for their preparation, in order to enable the Commission to consider the documents from the point of view of their contribution to the work of the Commission and of their urgency and relevance in the light of the current situation.

16. In accordance with rule 37 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council, the Commission reports to the Council on the work of each session.
