and policy and programme coordination****Enhanced cooperation and policy and programme coordination****Note by the Secretary-General**

1. At its first session, the United Nations Forum on Forests made provisions in its multi-year programme of work for enhanced cooperation and policy and programme coordination as a common item that will be addressed at each session of the Forum.¹ It was also decided that the Forum should cooperate and make active efforts to develop synergies with the members of the Collaborative Partnership on Forests;² the Commission on Sustainable Development and other functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council; and other regional processes and organizations, institutions and instruments.

2. The Forum particularly emphasized the important role of the Partnership in supporting the work of the Forum in achieving its objectives and in enhancing coordination and cooperation among its member organizations at the national, subregional, regional and global levels. The Partnership was established at its inaugural meeting, held in Rome in April 2001. The Partnership consists of international organizations, institutions and instruments that have the capacity, programmes and substantive resources to facilitate the Forum process, in particular the implementation of the proposals for action of the Intergovernmental Panel on Forests (IPF) and the Intergovernmental Forum on Forests (IFF).

3. The Partnership has met five times since its inauguration and has agreed, among other things, on its working modalities, including a focal agency system in which a focal agency of the Partnership would support Forum deliberations. Each focal agency would also act as a focal point for facilitating and coordinating activities of Partnership members towards the implementation of the IPF/IFF proposals for action related to given Forum elements.³ In that regard, in terms of technical assistance and cooperation activities at the national level, the Partnership

would act upon the request of countries. The focal agency of the Partnership would also facilitate the policy deliberations of the Forum, including by drafting and providing inputs to the reports of the Secretary-General on specific Forum elements. The focal agency of the Partnership would work closely with Partnership members and other partners, as appropriate.

4. Enhanced cooperation and policy and programme coordination has been allocated one meeting during the second session of the Forum, at which the Partnership will present its progress report on a framework for its contribution to the work of the Forum, followed by guidance and feedback from the Forum. However, it should be noted that member bodies of the Partnership can carry out its work only in accordance with the guidance provided by their respective governing bodies. In addition, the Forum may wish to discuss how to further enhance and strengthen cooperation and coordination and foster synergies between other relevant forums, both within and outside the United Nations system. A list of meetings scheduled for 2002 that are relevant to the Forum is provided in the table below.⁴
